

#### Here are some grants (that's money you don't have to pay back) for Mississippi's first-year college students:

#### Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant (MTAG)

#### Award Amount/Length of Eligibility:

- > Up to \$500/year for freshmen and sophomores
- > Up to \$1,000/year for juniors and seniors
- Max 8 semesters/12 trimesters

#### Initial Eligibility Requirements:

- > Cumulative 2.5 GPA
- > 15 ACT (national testing) or 720 SAT
- Must NOT be eligible for full federal Pell grant
- » Mississippi resident
- > Full-time enrollment at eligible Mississippi institution

Online Application Deadline: September 15 Supporting Document Deadline: October 15

#### Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant (MESG)

- Award Amount/Length of Eligibility:
  - > Up to \$2,500/year
  - Max 8 semesters/12 trimesters

#### Initial Eligibility Requirements:

- Cumulative 3.5 GPA
- > 29 ACT (national testing) or 1290 SAT
- Mississippi resident
- Full-time enrollment at eligible Mississippi institution

Online Application Deadline: September 15 Supporting Document Deadline: October 15

#### Higher Education Legislative Plan for Needy Students (HELP)

#### Award Amount/Length of Eligibility:

- Tuition and fees at a public institution (or equivalent amount at private)
- Max 10 semesters/15 trimesters

#### Initial Eligibility Requirements:

- Cumulative 2.5 GPA
- > 20 ACT (national testing)
- MUST complete specific HELP Core Curriculum
- MUST complete the FAFSA CAN be full Pell eligible
- MUST provide evidence of annual family Adjusted Gross Income
- Mississippi resident
- Full-time enrollment at eligible Mississippi institution

Online Application Deadline: March 31 Supporting Document Deadline: April 30

#### There's More Where That Came From

The state also offers forgivable loans for future teachers and nurses. Forgivable loans are even available for students pursuing certain graduate degrees. Forgivable loans are cool because you don't have to pay them back if you complete your degree and work in the state!

## State of Mississippi Teacher Education Forgivable Loans

### Aid for Undergraduate Students Pursuing a Teacher License

## William Winter Teacher and Alternate Route Teacher Forgivable Loan (WWTS/WWAR)

- Available to: Juniors/Seniors majoring in education or field leading to alternate route education
  - Eligibility: Mississippi residents with 3.0 GPA
  - Loan: Repayable through service or money
  - Service: 1 year in Mississippi public/charter school for each year of money received
  - Amount: \$4,000/year for 2 years; max \$8,000
  - Online Application Deadline: March 31
  - Document Deadline: April 30

#### Teacher Education Scholars Forgivable Loan (TES)

- Available to: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors enrolling in a program of study leading to a Class "A" teacher license
- Eligibility: Students with a 3.5 GPA and a 28 ACT score
- Loan: Repayable through service or money
- Service: 5 years in Mississippi public school for any amount of loan received
- Amount: Up to \$15,000/year for up to 4 years (8 semesters or 12 trimesters)
- Online Application Deadline: March 31
- Document Deadline: April 30

#### Aid for Students Pursuing an Alternate Route Teacher License

## Teacher Education Alternate Route Certification Scholars Forgivable Loan (TESA)

- Available to: Students with a Bachelor's Degree enrolling in a certification program (Mississippi Alternate Path to Quality Teachers Training Institution, Teach Mississippi Institute, Career Tech Education, or Master's Degree program) leading to an Alternate Route teacher license
- Eligibility: Mississippi residents with a 3.0 GPA on the final 60 hours of undergraduate coursework
  - and passing Praxis test scores
- Loan: Repayable through service or money
- Service: 1 year in a Mississippi public/charter school for each year of loan received
- Amount: Total cost of 1 certification program, not to exceed \$5,000/year for length of program
- Online Application Deadline: March 31
- Document Deadline: April 30

## Loan Repayment for Teachers with an Alternate Route Teacher License

### Mississippi Teacher Loan Repayment Program (MTLR)

- Available to: Teachers with an Alternate Route teacher license who are currently teaching in a Mississippi public/charter school in a critical shortage geographic or subject area
- Eligibility: Must NOT have received state aid for teachers as an undergraduate student and must have outstanding undergraduate student loans
- Loan Repayment Amount: Up to \$3,000/year for up to 4 years; \$12,000 max
- Online Application Deadline: March 31
- Document Deadline: April 30

## Aid for Students Pursuing a Graduate Degree in Teaching, Counseling or Administration

## Graduate Teacher, Counselor and School Administrator Forgivable Loan (GTS/CSA)

- Available to: MS public school teachers seeking first master's degree
- Eligibility: Mississippi residents with 3.0 GPA
- Loan: Repayable through service or money
- Service: Teach full-time while in school and 1 year after degree completion
- Amount: Reimbursement of tuition at \$125/hour for up to 12 hours per term
- Online Application Deadline: March 31
- Document Deadline: April 30

### Critical Needs Dyslexia Therapy Forgivable Loan (CNDT)

- Available to: Students seeking a first master's degree in Dyslexia Therapy
- Eligibility: First-time graduate students seeking a class "AA" MS Educator License with a 203 (Dyslexia Therapy) designation
- Loan: Repayable through service or money
- Service: 1 year in Mississippi public school for each year of money received
- Amount: Tuition, materials and fees
- Online Application Deadline: March 31
- Document Deadline: April 30
