From the Literacy Coach ...

What is the **Questioning Strategy** for reading comprehension?



Students who use the **questioning strategy** while reading always ask themselves questions about what they are reading. When readers are asking questions while reading, they are connected to the text and always make sure they understand what is being read. It is VERY important that students ask questions while reading text.

Here are some questions to remind your child/children to ask while reading:

What does this title mean?
Is there a word you do not understand?
What does this paragraph mean?
What do the illustrations tell you?
What parts of the story did you like?
Can you make any connections to the text?
