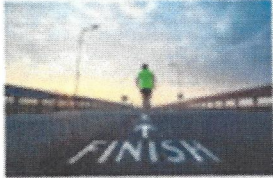
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K-1 June News

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Third Grade Wildcat June News

Reading

In June, we will continue reading informative text (nonfiction) to determine the supporting details of main ideas and to describe the sequence or cause/effect of events. With literary (fiction), reading our focus will continue to recount/retell a story, determine the message or lesson, and describe the characters' traits and motivations.

Writing responses from [tumblebook.com](https://www.tumblebook.com) videos: (Point of View and Main Idea/Detail)

Clown fish come in different colors. They use the predator's tentacles to protect themselves. Normally a sea anemone stings its prey, but the clown fish is covered in slime, or mucus. The narrator called their relationship a mockery. Clownfish are interesting. I wonder what the clown fish eat.

Scientists study how emperor penguins dive with devices attached to their back. They can hold their breath for 20 minutes to dive and catch ice fish. They have layers of feathers and fat to keep them warm. The ice shelves give them shelter from their predator, the leopard sea lion. It must be fun, but cold to stay 2 weeks to count the population of penguins. With climate change, the ice shelves break and float off as ice burls. This causes obstacles for the penguins to travel between their colony and the ocean to feed.

Math

Our focus in June will continue reviewing and extending on fractions, multiplication, division, time, and subtracting with regrouping. Please continue practicing the multiplication facts for long term memory. This mastery is essential for division, fractions, and solving word problems next school year.

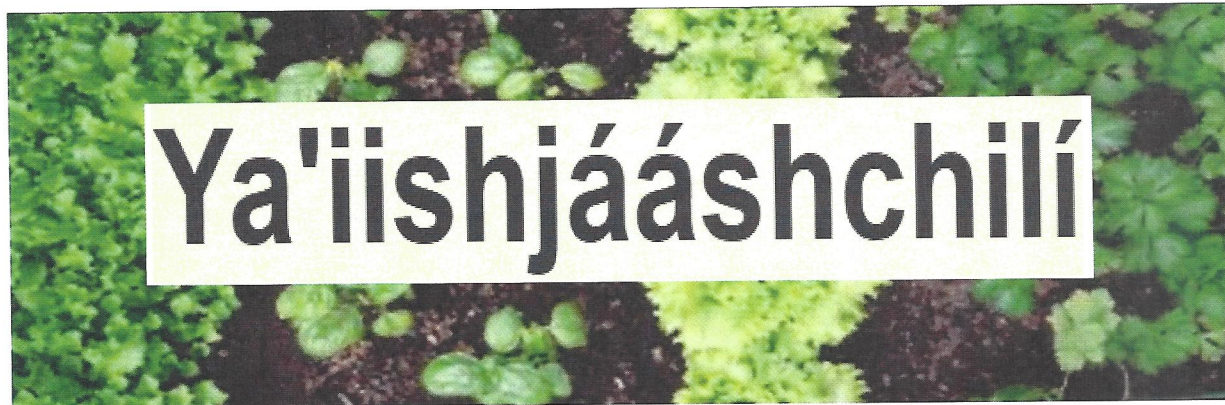

4th Grade Academic Updates

Reading: We have finished reading information presented in charts, graphs, and time lines. We will begin to read stories that have similar topics, then compare and contrast stories that have similar patterns of events. Fourth graders, please continue to read independently at home by utilizing the Tumblebooks-
www.tumblebookslibrary.com online and record your reading on your reading log.

Math- We will continue to learn about strategies and properties to multiply by 1-digit, and 2-digit numbers. Fourth graders, please continue to practice and know your math facts in addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. One of the best ways to have your child know the facts is to practice daily. You can use games, flashcards, versatiles, and online math games. I will be sending home flashcards for you to use and to keep at home.

Writing- We will continue to focus writing using quick writes, short responses, and narrative writing. We will learn to brainstorming ideas, planning, organizing, and elements of a narrative writing.
