Carol Anderson Has Always Been a Devoted Servant to Education and Warren Community

This is the long overdue story of a North Dakota farm girl who earns a college degree and is hired to teach in Warren, MN. After teaching here for a few years, she makes Warren her life-long home. For over forty years, she has been a pillar of the education community as well as the Warren community.

Throughout those years, Warren and WAO alumni along with many friends she has made during this era have come to realize the good fortune we inherited when she decided to make this area her permanent home.

Carol Anderson's story begins many miles away from her present home. She was born in Fargo, ND and grew up in Sargent County which is way down in the southeast corner of North Dakota. She said, "Our family farm was located one mile north of the South Dakota line and 18 miles west of the Minnesota line." She went to a country school for grades 1-5. When that school closed, she attended school in Veblen, South Dakota through 9th grade, but then it was decided students were not permitted to cross state lines for schooling. She spent her

10th-12th grades at Lidgerwood, ND. She knew none of her new classmates and it was long distance to call there from her farm. She stated, "My main connection with classmates was with those I went to college with. Our class of 1964 had the distinction of being the largest class (51) as well as the last class to graduate from the old school building at Lidgerwood High School." When asked about her favorite and least favorite classes, she replied, "I took two years of typing and I recall speech class as being favorable. I disliked the sewing part of Home Ec. and Geometry."

Carol's immediate family consisted of her parents and one sister. Her parents moved from the farm to Wahpeton, ND in 2003. Her father died in 2010 at age 91 and her 98 year old mother lives in Breckenridge and was also a teacher. Her sister, Nancy, is a college Dean of Students in Michigan, so it is plain to see that education is an important priority in Carol's family. Being of Swedish heritage, Carol and her parents enjoyed family trips to Sweden four different times making many family connections that are still kept today.

After high school, Carol attended Valley City Teachers College where her mother and aunt attended years before. She received her degree in 1968. She commented, "Becoming a teacher had always been a dream of mine and I 'played school' constantly. My fourth grade teacher was my biggest inspiration. When I student taught at a Fargo public school, she happened to be a first grade teacher in the room right next to the classroom I was in. Years earlier, my mother had been her second grade teacher in country school."

Following her college graduation, it was time to find a job. She stated, "I had not heard of Warren,

MN until I found a brochure about the city in the placement office at Valley City. It portrayed Warren as a successful community in the Northern Red River Valley. I wrote a letter of application and former Warren superintendent, Melvin Hanson, called and asked for an interview. I met with him and former elementary principal, Richard Sauer. They told me during the interview, a bond issue had just passed to build a new open concept elementary school. The next day they sent me a contract and I returned it, signed. I came to Warren for a visit and met fourth grade teacher, Edla Winberg. She immediately welcomed me and became a wonderful mentor to me during my first year of teaching, which was her last year. Over the years, I formed great friendships with many colleagues and became life-long friends. I had offers to leave during my early years and seriously considered re-locating, but in the 70's I was getting more established in the community activities and some districts were starting to lay off teachers. I felt job security was better in Warren than other areas, so I stayed." And she stayed for 38 years. Was it mentioned that during those years and now into retirement she makes the best German chocolate cake ever?

With all the great friendships she has made with so many former students and fellow teachers, it is hard to talk about those types of memories without mentioning names. That will come when she decides to write her autobiography. However, there were some remembrances she wanted to point out saying, "The old elementary building had so much character whether you were on the upper level with the outdoor fire escapes on down to the paper storage room in the deep basement. The cleanliness and

(Continued from page 1) shine of all the buildings always stood out thanks to the devoted custodial staff and that trait certainly continues today. Classroom memories are plentiful. Our theme weeks where the school would be transformed into camping; a foreign country; pioneer life; fourth grade green party (those were the days you could bring food in); mini-classes; the first book fairs; making quilts for the Warren Centennial and numerous other projects." In this case, the word "numerous" is seriously understated.

With all the energy and tireless extra hours she put into her teaching career, one would think she would have little time for outside activities. If you thought that, you do not know Carol J. Anderson. Her service with education and community boards and committees is endless. It starts with the local Warren Education Association; the Kramer Brown Uniserv and the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, which she is still a member and had served on the chapter and state level as committee chairman. She has served Our Savior's Lutheran Church as a Sunday school teacher, on many committees including congregational chairman and currently serves as the wedding and funeral coordinator. Community boards she has served on include the Godel Memorial Library; the Landmark Housing Authority; North Valley Health Center; Girl Scout leader and Ninth District President of the General Federation of Women's Clubs. Her involvement with the local Mawami Club, included with other members, brought Lifeline to the Warren area. She was named

in separate years, the Outstanding Young Woman of the Year and Educator of the Year at the Town and Country banquet. She was also named by a local Education Minnesota group as Friend of Education. She still had time to whip up those unbelievable German chocolate cakes!

Retiring from her teaching tenure in 2006 should have earned Carol well-deserved rest and relaxation, but she would have none of that. She had always been fascinated with the beet harvest campaign. Being a farm girl who never shied away from challenges, she decided to inquire about a job at the "beet dump". She stated, "After applying and getting hired, I worked the ground taking samples and shoveling beets the first year. By my third year, I began running the piler, which I have done from 2008-2015. I have also volunteered for a week during the summer the past ten years at the Medora Foundation in western North Dakota. During the school year, if the phone rings at 6:00 am, it's usually the elementary school asking if I can substitute teach which I enjoy doing. I've also spent many weekends with my mom in Breckenridge."

That brings us to one of her most cherished service commitments which is her years of being a board member including long-term chairman of the Warren-Alvarado-Oslo Education Foundation. She says, "A board member asked me if I was interested in becoming actively involved with the Ed Foundation. I'd heard of the Ed Foundation over the years and was a dues-paying member. One thing led to another and before I knew it, I was on the board and eventually became chairman. Nancy Mattson, Marie Goodwin

and Denise Laymon were and still are my mentors and I have leaned on them often over the years. It has been gratifying to watch the Ed Foundation grow into the strong organization it is today. Probably the highest honor I've ever received was when an alumnus introduced a fundraiser which created an endowment in my name to help with some of our school's financial needs. Our board and Foundation members / volunteers work tirelessly to raise funds for our education community."

It took a few years of asking, pleading and almost threatening Carol to give her permission to do a feature on her. It was always "Nobody is interested in what I've done and it's no big deal anyway." After reading her story, I'm sure you will beg to differ. She has been a leader with no qualms about being a "mover and a shaker" in any organization, committee or group she has been associated with. She always claims she is the lucky one in all this and commented, "Over the past forty plus years, I've been proud to call Warren home. Many fine people, alumni and friends have been a huge influence on me. The quote by Flavia Weedn, "Some people come into our lives and quickly go. Some stay for a while, leave footprints on our hearts and we are never, ever the same," tells me I've been the recipient of many footprints."

For all who have come to know, respect and love Carol, we are so thankful that she decided to stay for a while. She has left her footprints on our hearts and we are better people having her in our lives. And she makes fantastic German chocolate cake!

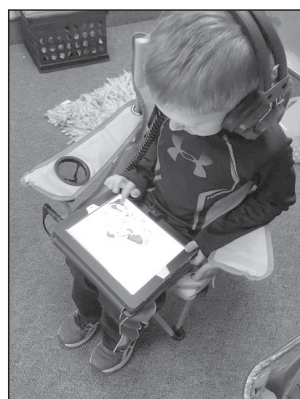
