

Agriculture Mechanics Class Outline

Course:

This course develops knowledge and technical skills in the broad field of agricultural machinery, equipment, and structures. The primary purpose of this course is to prepare students to handle the day-to-day problems, accidents, and repair needs they will encounter in their chosen agricultural career. Topics include agricultural mechanics safety, agricultural engineering career opportunities, hand/power tool use and selection, electrical wiring, basic metal working, basic agricultural construction skills related to plumbing, concrete, carpentry, basic welding, and leadership development

Laboratory:

This course will require students to participate in laboratory activities, work experiences and field trips. Students must have a safety contract with the appropriate signatures on file with the teacher before participating in any out of class activity. A school insurance policy and/or a private policy is required for students taking this course.

Student Organization (FFA):

All students are highly encouraged to participate in the FFA Organization. Some opportunities offered by the FFA are local activities, career development events, travel, awards, and monthly magazine. Membership fees are \$15.00 and our class goal is 100% membership.
