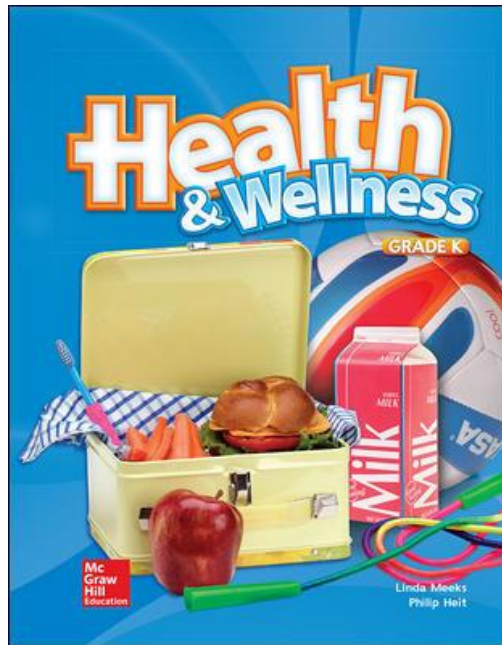

2009	Human Sexuality Education	OAR Rule 581-022-1440	Comprehensive sex education K-12
2012	Healthy Teens Relationship Act	HB 4077	Teen dating violence/domestic violence/healthy relationships Grades 7-12

History of Health Education Laws in Oregon

Year	Name	Legal Name	Description
2009	Human Sexuality Education	OAR Rule 581-022-1440	Comprehensive sex education (as well as child abuse prevention, healthy relationships, goal setting)
2012	Healthy Teens Relationship Act	HB 4077	Age appropriate education for grades 7-12 about teen dating violence/domestic violence - focus on healthy relationships
2016	Erin's Law: Child Sex Abuse Prevention	SB 856	Developmentally appropriate/culturally sensitive child sex abuse prevention K-12, at least 4 X per year.

Where is Erin's Law?

There are 42 million sexual abuse survivors in America; 3 million are children, which would fill 46 national football stadiums.

60 PERCENT OF CHILDREN AROUND THE COUNTRY, 7 PERCENT IS A STUDENT.



1 IN 4 GIRLS AND 1 IN 6 BOYS EXPERIENCED SEXUAL ABUSE BEFORE THE AGE OF 18.

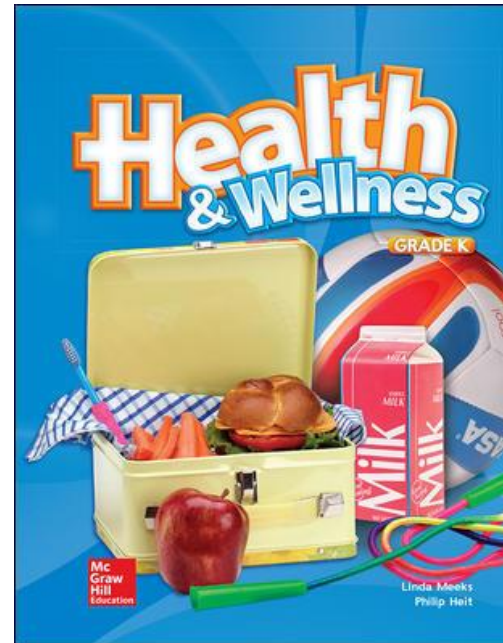

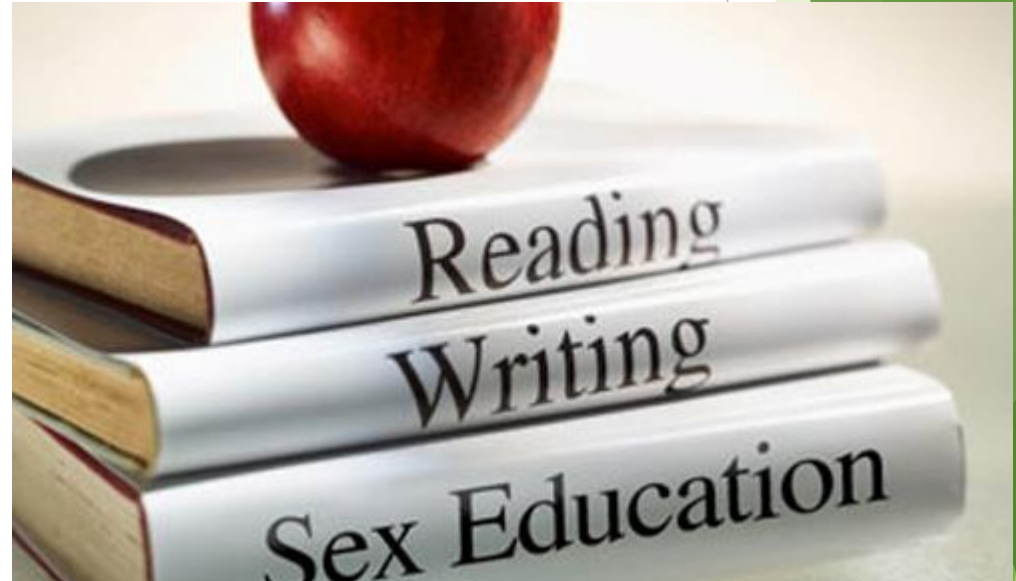
Health Education Part 1 - General Health

Health Education Part 2/Erin's Law

- ▶ Puberty Education/Sex Education
- ▶ Healthy Relationships
- ▶ Sex Abuse Prevention Education



SB 856 Requirements

Schools shall provide child sexual abuse prevention instruction kindergarten through grade 12.

This includes:

- ▶ ● A minimum of 4 instructional sessions per year, K-12.



In addition....

Instruction is:

- ▶ age appropriate,
- ▶ medically accurate,
- ▶ and is not shame--or fear--based.



Also...

Instruction is:

- ▶ culturally inclusive and...
- ▶ responsive to diverse students including race, ethnicity, gender identity and sexual orientation.



And...

- ▶ ● Trauma informed instruction and services.



And more...

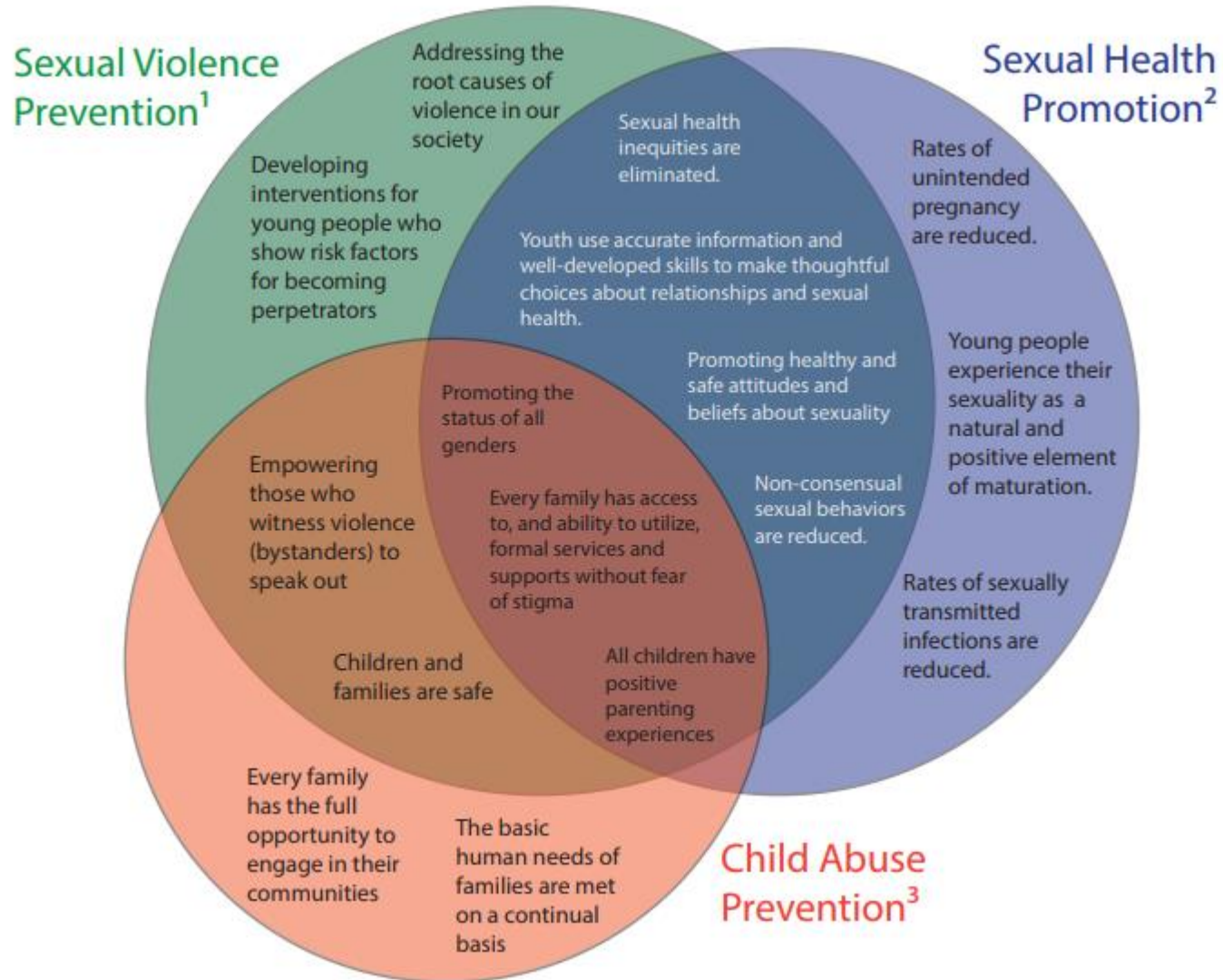
- ▶ ● A parental involvement component
 - Welcome to review curricula
 - Informational meetings

Abstinence is still recognized as the most effective way of preventing pregnancies.

Additional Parental Input Option...

- ▶ Substitute lessons in place of Erin's Law lessons
- ▶ Substitute lesson forms available at schools

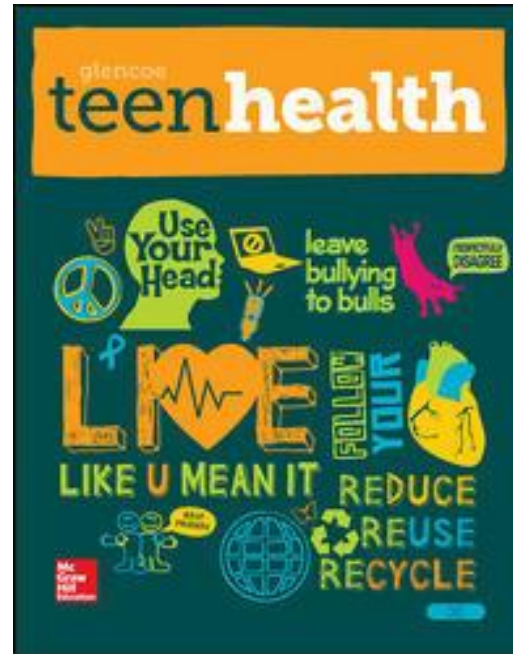
