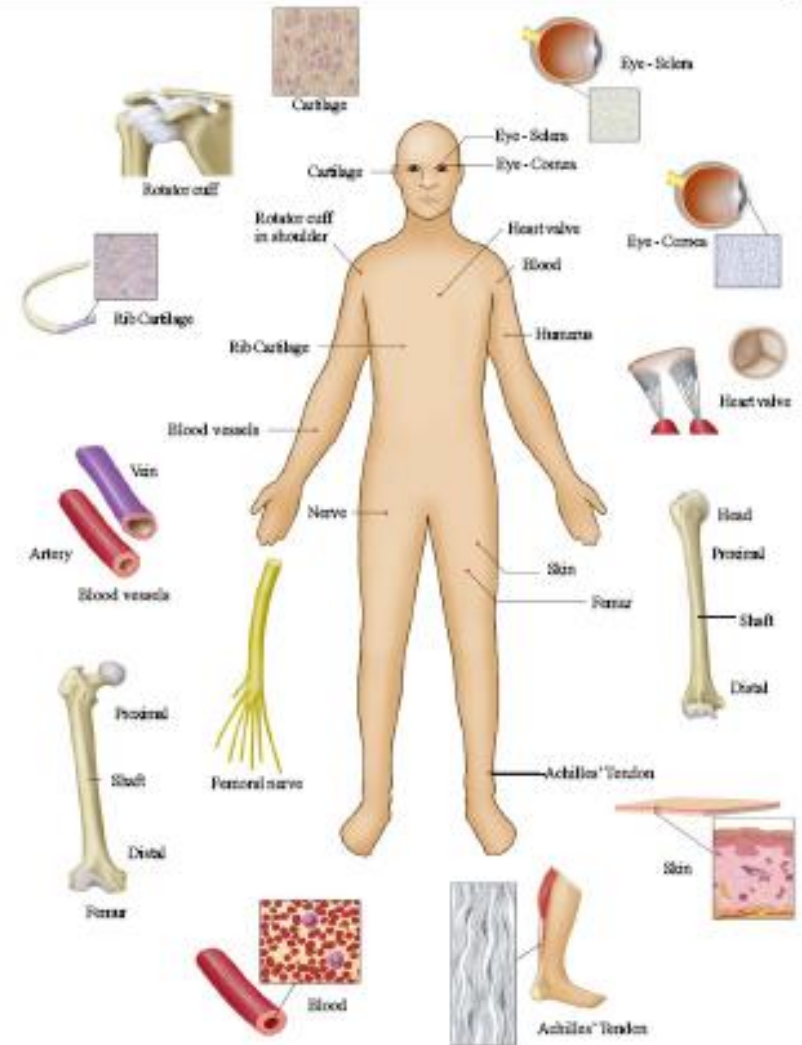
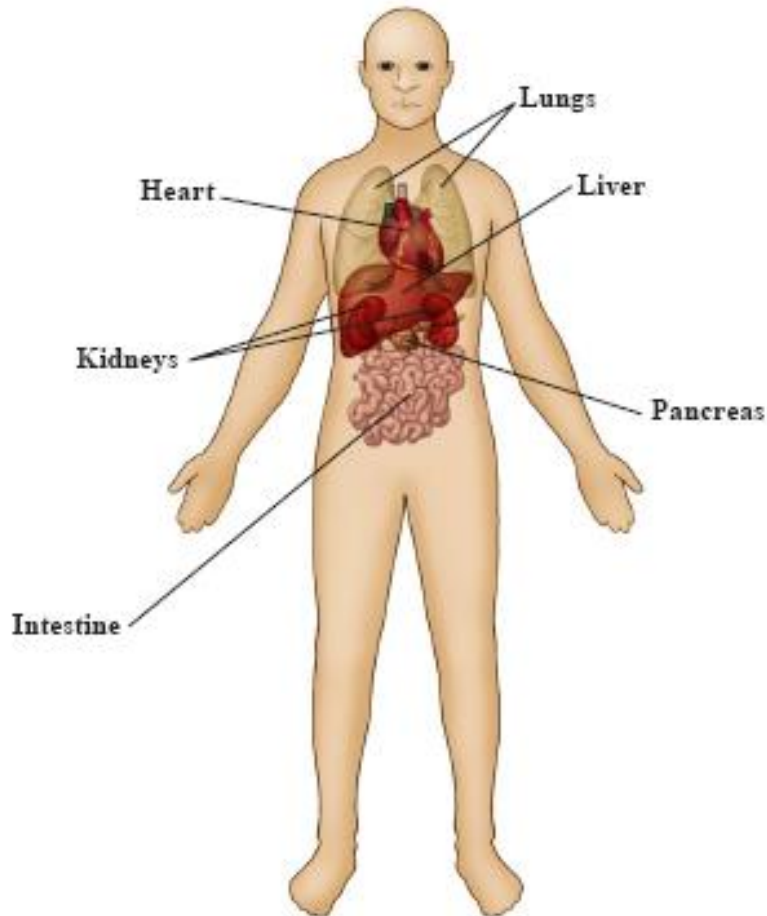
# Voter Registration 6.
