"When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things" (Mark 6:34). Dear Parishioners,

This might seem like an off topic to write about, but it is timely. Even so, it is related to our spiritual lives in that it attempts not to open us up to being taken advantage of by those who would seek to defraud. There have been at least two scam attempts in the last weeks that I have been involved in – one was that someone pretending to be me texted parishioners asking for a favor of \$200 in iTunes gift cards and I received a scam email from someone pretending to be Bishop LeVoir asking for a favor. Sadly, the people that attempt such a thing are exploiting both the virtues of generosity and kindness. In the end, it is a form of theft – attempted identity theft even if there is a response. Such activity does harm to the individual they are attempting to impersonate, and it harms the innocence of the person(s) they attempt to defraud.

First, a little reminder that I would never ask for a 'favor' or gift cards through text or email (and only ask for a favor for the good of the parish – eg, asking someone to help with lectoring a funeral but NEVER money or goods for myself or someone else). I would never 'cold call' you – reach out to you without your first giving me your contact information. Please ignore all requests from someone claiming to be me or another priest or even a bishop if your suspicions are raised – and after the rest of what I write here, you will be better prepared to have those suspicions raised.

With both of these incidents, there were obvious red flags. That is why I am encouraging us to ask the following questions to ask before responding to any "odd" request whether from supposedly a priest/pastor/Bishop or in any other strange request like a grandchild in jail, or a medical emergency.

 Did you ever receive a text or email from the supposed person before? Does the telephone number or full email match? If it doesn't, contact the person directly by phone or a known email. Neither of these incidents were from previously known communication methods. I do not have your cell numbers or emails unless you first gave them to me, but my telephone number is in the bulletin. Do not pay attention to the "Maybe" name listed – there are apparently ways of creating that heading. Bishop LeVoir's email was not at a recognized server – and was at one that anyone could create an address in any name they pleased – think gmail. That is why I will attempt to use only my dnu.org account – only the diocesan staff can create addresses on that server. As in the case of someone pretending to be a officer of the law, get as much



information as possible and confirm it – if they won't give their name or contact information, walk away!

- 2. Does the money truly go where you think? Have you confirmed the email or telephone number? Like above, there was no way of being certain that it was to go to the person that they claimed to be. The text scam last week was from an unknown number and would have gone to that unknown number by taking a picture of the cards' information and texting it. In another scam a number of years ago, I had someone impersonating a priest attempting to get money for a surgery for a parishioner I was skeptical and so asked that the money be wired through the diocesan offices he gave a false diocese name and number.
- 3. Does the request, such as asking for a specific amount of money in iTunes or Google play, truly help a person from what they are claiming? Is it really an emergency that requires you to send it without seeing them or speaking directly? This should be a huge red flag! With those impersonating me, they wanted \$200 Apple gift cards. It is good for Apple products and on Apple App Store that's it. That is of no benefit to someone dying of cancer in the hospital as they claimed. "Bishop LeVoir's" request was odd, to say the least.
- 4. Does the person use a name (with correct spelling) or title or use other words or phrases with what you are accustomed to hearing or seeing? This one said it was from "Pastor" Todd Petersen and that I was too "busy" to answer or call. I am a pastor, yes, but I only use the title "Father". Those that know me well know that I despise that word "busy" only the phone is busy, unless someone is acting busy to avoid work. The email from "Bishop LeVoir" referred to my apostate (he would only use ministry for a priest), and basically complained about his ongoing ministry as a Bishop he is fully retired and seems to be enjoying it from the other times I have heard from him.

Reminder a lesson from the kitchen, if the salmon smells fishy, it is not good – throw it away. It goes for scams, too. If something is fishy, trust your instincts. Walk away, contact the police, and pass this message on to those most vulnerable because of their kindness and generosity.
