Dual Enrollment

What is Dual Enrollment?

Dual Enrollment, taking college courses while still in high school, allows students to earn credits in both high school and college courses at the same time. This opportunity allows students to see if college is a good fit for them, to get a jump-start on their college careers, and to help equip them for college success.

Program Description:



The Huron Intermediate School District partners with Mid Michigan College to offer a dual enrollment program to all interested Huron County students. This program is housed at the HATC. The cohort is for students interested in either getting a head start on their college education or just want to challenge themselves by taking college courses to see if this type of post-secondary training is the right fit for them. Interested students can start the cohort as early as their sophomore year, but most choose to begin either their junior or senior year and can earn up to 44 college credits. These general education classes go towards fulfilling the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA), and are transferrable to other colleges in the state of Michigan. Local school districts and the HISD cover the costs of these courses. Laptops are available to use while students are at the HATC and the textbooks for the cohort classes that students will need are provided.

Students will take the following classes as part of this cohort:

1st Year

- ✓ English 111/112
- ✓ Intermediate Algebra/College Algebra/Pre-Calculus
- ✓ Psychology
- ✓ Oral Communication
- ✓ Statistics

2nd Year

- ✓ English 222
- ✓ College Algebra/Pre-Calculus
- ✓ Western Civilization
- ✓ Political Science
- ✓ College Biology
- ✓ Geology/Sociology/Medical Terminology

Deviations from the cohort can occur during the second year depending on what classes individual students need for their intended program of study or if they choose to complete the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA). It is highly encouraged that students talk to the University that they are interested in attending to discuss how the classes will transfer and whether or not completing the MTA would be beneficial.
