Our Goals for Student Achievement

District goal(s)

- K-12 students will meet or exceed grade-level reading goals each academic year.
- Decrease the percentage of students missing six days or more from 44% in 2016 to 40% by 2022.

School goal(s) and focus areas(s)

- Northwest will strengthen classroom instruction—measured by decreasing the percentage of students performing at Level 1 by 10% annually on the Georgia Milestones in ELA and math.
- Northwest will strengthen data analysis by developing a common data analysis framework.

- *Set aside a special place for homework & make sure homework is completed on a regular basis
- *Discuss what happens in class and in school; Know what my child is learning
- *Use strategies provided by the school to help my child academically and socially

Student Responsibilities

- *Attend school regularly & arrive at school on time at 7:20
- *Eat a good breakfast
- *Obey the Wildcat Way throughout the different areas of the school
- *Will read at home for a minimum of twenty minutes each night either independently or with a parent.
- *Come to school each day with pencils, paper, & other necessary tools for learning
- *Monitor your own progress
- *Read at least 20 minutes a day
- *Practice math facts until fluent
