This program enables high school students to become MOS certified at no cost to the student and thus providing opportunities for the 21st century workforce. Abigail scored a perfect score of 1000 on the Microsoft Office PowerPoint 2013 exam while posting scores in excess of 950 in both Excel 2013 and Word 2013. Abigail's accomplishment is quite extraordinary as she is the only student at Perry High to successfully pass all three areas within Microsoft Office in one school year. Abigail is also an honor student who ranks in the top twenty in the graduation class and has plans to attend Valdosta State University in the Fall of 2016.

Students completing at least three courses in a career pathway took state approved certifying exams this spring. The End of Pathway Assessments (EOPA) is used to ascertain the technical skill attainment level of students in career and technical education courses. Students attending the Houston County Career Academy may choose to study one of the following pathways; cosmetology, criminal justice, culinary arts, engineering, healthcare science, information technology, teaching as a profession, or welding.

These pathway areas boast 100% pass rate cosmetology, criminal justice, information technology, teaching as a profession, and welding. In addition to passing the EOPA, these students also earned college credit.

Students in the healthcare pathways took national industry recognized exams; Certified Nursing Assistant in the patient care pathway and National Medical Office Exam in the Allied Health pathway.

Over 50 upcoming 9th and 10th grade students who are enrolled in the Houston County School System attended STEM project-based camp at the Houston County Career Academy May 31st – June 3rd. In Georgia, STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) education is defined as an integrated curriculum that is driven by problem solving, discovery, exploratory project/problem-based learning, and student-centered development of ideas and solutions.

During the four day STEM Camp, students participated in a variety of activities focused in the areas of engineering, automotive, and health science. Members of the local industry partners including Robins Air Force Base and the City of Warner Robins served as guest speakers.

Lisa Hardeegree, an Industrial Engineer at RAFB, served as one of the guest speakers to the Girls in Engineering Camp. Ms. Hardeegree shared her educational background and what it means to be an industrial engineer.

Being involved with hands-on activities is what Kiram Harrison, Houston County High School 9th grader, liked best about the Girls in Automotive Camp. She learned how to change a tire and other basic car repairs. “I had a great time, and will consider taking this class during high school,” said Harrison.

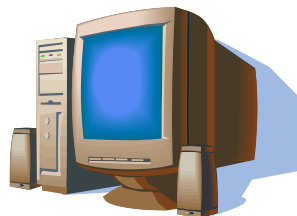

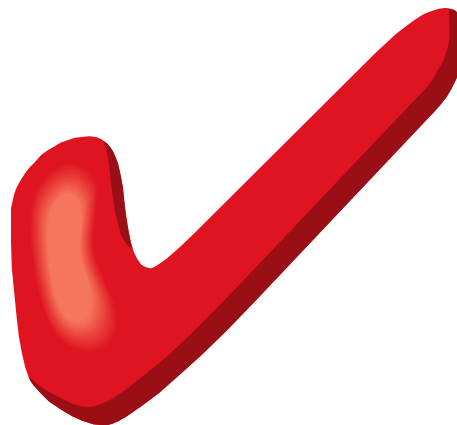

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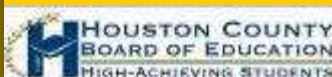
