Parent(s)/Guardian(s) of BCHS Dual Credit Student,

I am writing this letter in hopes to better explain our dual credit program. There have been changes to the program this year, and I would like to reach out to you so that we can all be on the same page in regards to your child's future. To begin, dual credit classes are classes we offer here at Breckinridge County High School that will count for credit both here at BCHS and at the partnering college. When it is time for your child to go to college, you can have the transcript sent from the partnering college to your child's college of choice by simply calling the Office of Admissions at the partnering college.

If your student is enrolled in any of the following courses on the next page, he or she is eligible to earn dual credit through the listed partnering college. Each course costs a maximum of \$58 per credit hour, so most courses cost around \$174 or less. Also, if your child is an 11th or 12th grade student, he or she is eligible to receive two classes free over his/her high school career. All your child has to do to claim these free courses is log on to his/her KHEAA account (the same website you would use to look up KEES money). The website is www.kheaa.com We encourage you to go ahead and log on with your child to claim which courses you will be using for the scholarship. To log on to the account, visit the website listed above and click "Sign In" and "Need to Register". Please be sure to keep this information in a secure place where you can access it again.

If you do not feel that your family can afford to pay for dual credit classes at this time, your student can still remain in the class without getting college credit for the course. However, we strongly encourage families to seriously consider this opportunity, as this option is far cheaper than the cost of taking these same courses once your child is actually in college.

All students who are enrolled in a dual credit course, whether they are getting college credit for it or not, are required to watch a video provided by the Kentucky Department of Education. If you would also like to watch this video, feel free to view it at https://education.ky.gov/educational/AL/dc/Pages/default.aspx The website also provides more information if you are interested. We will be watching the video during school as well. Students who are absent on that date must watch it at a later time, as it is a requirement from the state.

Scholarship Programs for Dual Credit Students - Preferences & Completion of Application

There are two different scholarship programs for Kentucky high school students enrolled in dual credit coursework during the 2019-2020 academic year. Students in grades 11 or 12 can use the Dual Credit Scholarship (DCS) program to pay tuition for up to two (2) dual credit courses. Students in grades 9-12 who are taking Career and Technical Education dual credit can use the Work Ready Dual Credit Scholarship (WKDC) program to pay tuition for two (2) dual credit courses. DCS provides funds for two scholarships per student. WKDC provides two scholarships each year.

Your Kentucky high school will begin the application process by submitting information to the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA). After receiving your school's information, KHEAA will determine the scholarship(s) you are eligible to receive and create a link on your MyKHEAA account for each scholarship program that applies. After that, you must go to KHEAA's website and sign in to your MyKHEAA account to complete the process. Instructions for telling KHEAA which college and semester you prefer for your scholarship(s) are below.

Note, you WILL NOT be considered for scholarship funding UNTIL AFTER you submit your scholarship preferences on KHEAA's website.

Step 1: Go to www.kheaa.com. Click on the 'Sign In' link to go to your MyKHEAA account. If you are a first time user, you will need to click on 'Sign In', then 'Register' to set up your MyKHEAA account.




Step 2: Click on the 'MyKHEAA' link to access your account.



Step 3: Click on the 'Set preferences' link for each scholarship program that appears on your Current Account Information screen. **If you do not see the link(s) you need, contact KHEAA customer service at (800) 928-8926.**


Note, the "Apply Online for Scholarships" section contains applications for other programs that are not related to DCS and WKDC. Only the set preference links on your current account page can be used to submit your request for DCS and/or WKDC.




Step 4: Follow the instructions to set your Dual Credit Scholarship and/or Work Ready KY Scholarship preferences. Click the 'Submit Scholarship Request' button when you are finished.



Step 5: On the next screen, review your information to make sure it is correct. If everything is good, click on the 'Confirm Preferences' button to complete your submission. If you need to make changes, click the 'Edit Preferences' button to go back to the previous page. Do not click on the back arrow at the top of your browser window.



Step 6: You will receive a confirmation page when the process is complete. KHEAA will notify you when scholarship award decisions are finalized.



NOTE: DCS and/or WKDC can be requested in any combination to meet your academic needs. If you are submitting preferences for both programs, you'll need to go through the process once using the DCS link and then again using the WKDC link. Keep in mind that WKDC can only be used for qualifying Career and Technical Education dual credit courses. DCS can be used for any dual credit courses, General Education or Career and Technical Education.
