Example: COMPUTER APPLICATIONS and KEYBOARDING will be deleted and not available for the 2016-2017 school year, these courses will remain in MSIS until July 1, 2016.

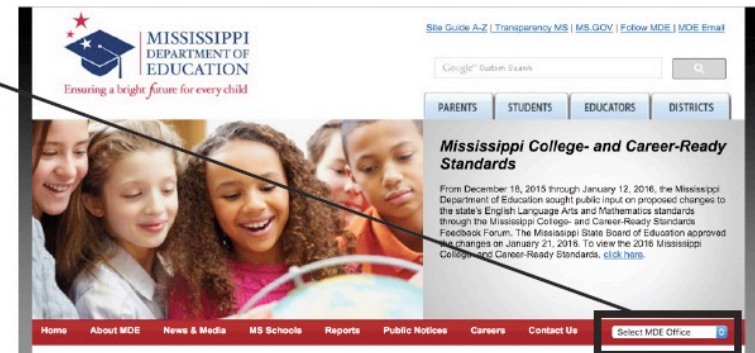

APPROVED SECONDARY COURSE CODES REPORT for the Secondary Schools of Mississippi

The following procedures will help district administrators and counselors keep abreast of “just in time” changes to courses, course codes and other relevant information on approved courses. Administrators and counselors should periodically review approved courses through the MSIS electronic database in order to make the correct decisions for helping students develop their Individual Career and Academic Plan and prepare for graduation and post-secondary requirements.

Every counselor should be able to access MSIS through “limited” access with a personal log-in. If you do not have a log-in, ask for assistance from the district MSIS data manager. In order to generate the Approved Secondary Course Codes Report, please follow these steps:

1. From the website (www.mde.k12.ms.us), select Technology and Strategic Services from the drop-down menu on the right side of the red navigation bar.

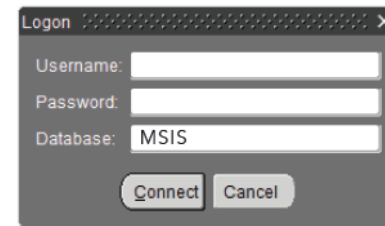


2. Choose MSIS Log-on from the left side of the Office of Technology and Strategic Services page.

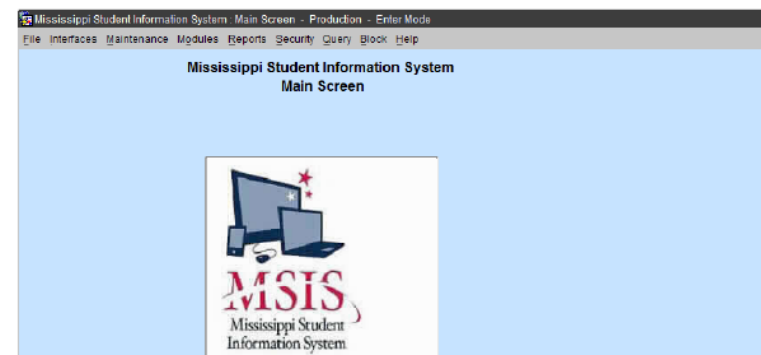

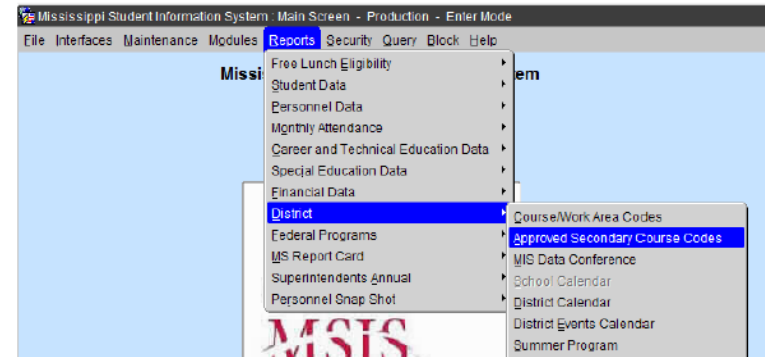
3. Log-on to MSIS, making sure to use the appropriate credentials. In the "Database" field, type MSIS.



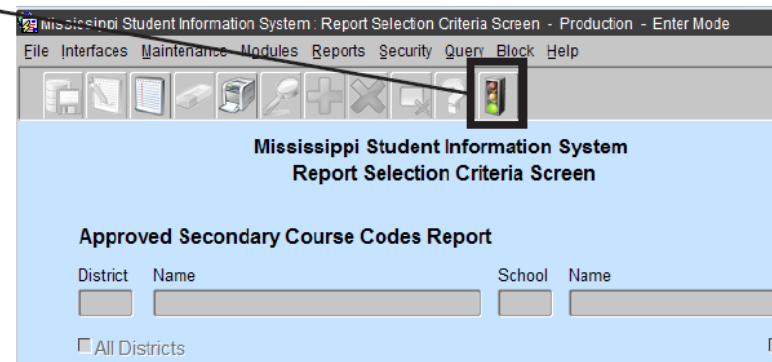
4. Once you have logged in, you should see the main view page.



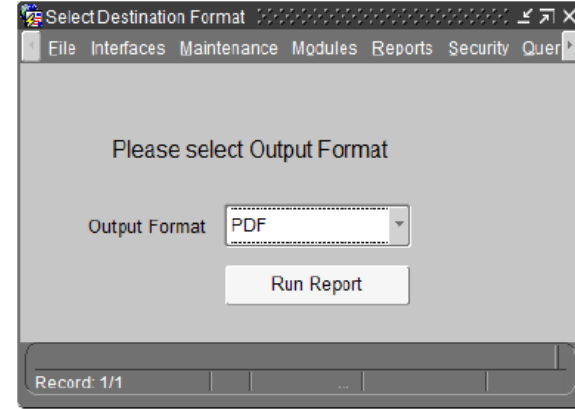
5. In the Menu bar at the top of the screen, choose Reports > District > Approved Secondary Course Codes.

**Standard Diploma
2017-2018**

Each student graduating from a secondary school in an accredited school district will have earned the required Carnegie units as specified in the following table. Contents of each required and elective course must include the core objectives identified in the *Mississippi College- and Career-Readiness Standards*. Course titles and identification numbers must appear in the current edition of the *Approved Courses for Secondary Schools of Mississippi*. (See 7 Miss. Admin. Code Pt. 3, Ch. 28, R. 28.2, R. 28.3.) Students enrolled in grades 7-12 may be awarded a Carnegie unit credit provided the course content is a Carnegie unit bearing course in the current edition of the *Approved Courses for the Secondary Schools of Mississippi Manual*. Enrollment in online courses must have prior approval granted by the principal.

Any student who completes the minimum graduation requirements as specified below and has met the requirements for each of the required high school assessments is eligible to receive a high school diploma. The local school district may establish additional local requirements approved by the local school board as authorized under Miss. Code Ann. § 37-16-7.

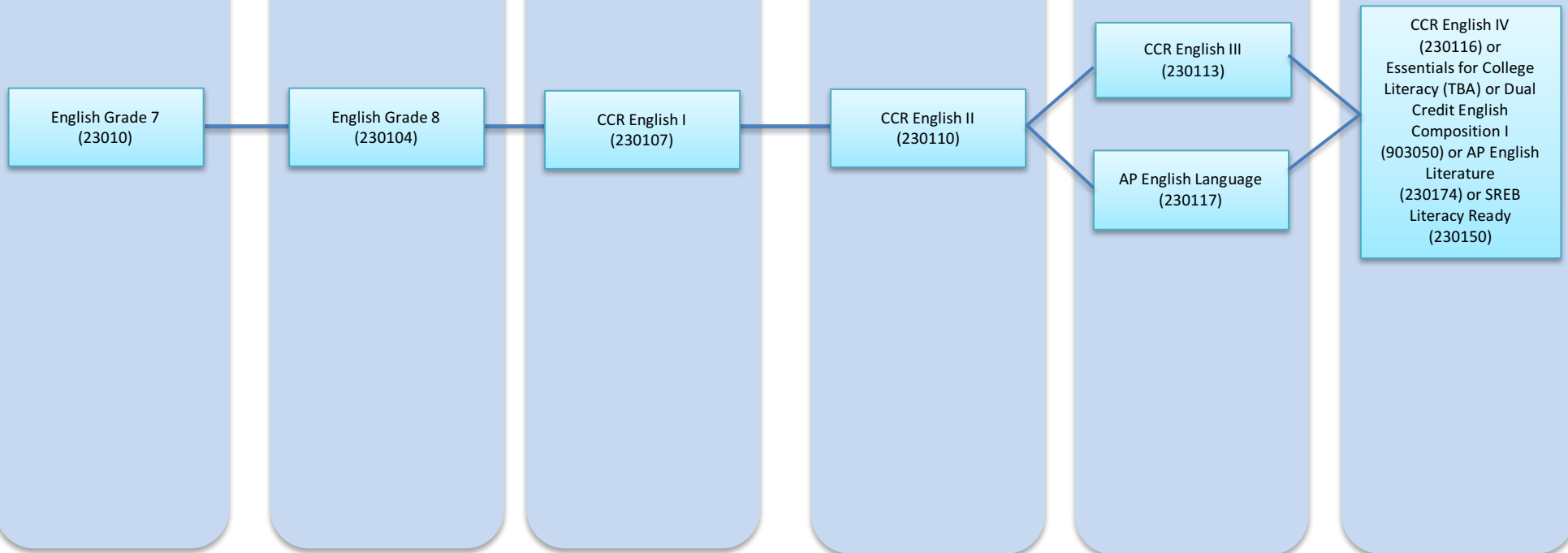

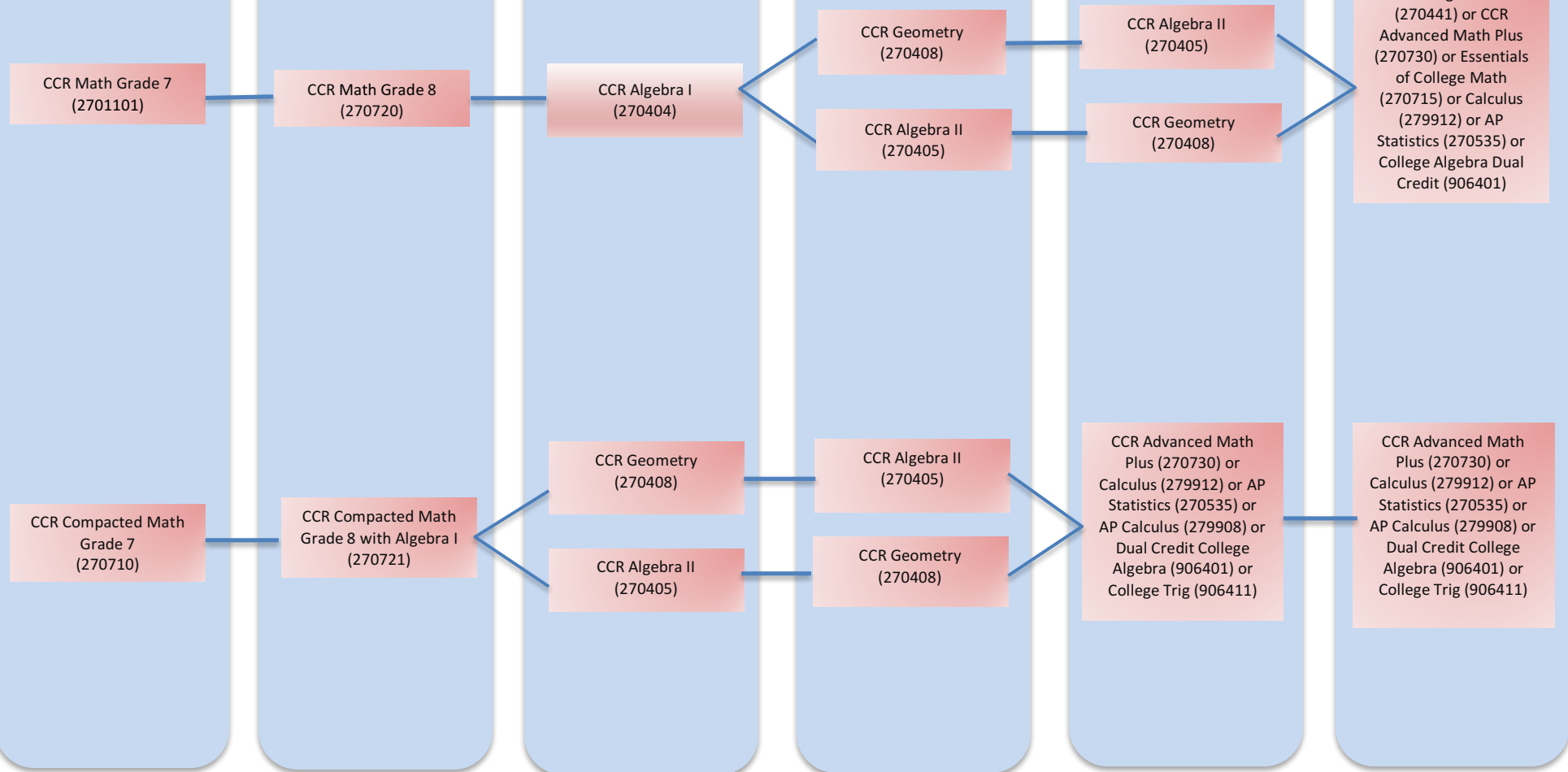

Overview of the Program

Established by legislation in 2006, the Mississippi Virtual Public School (MVPS) is a tuition-free program that offers students the option to enroll in online courses to supplement their traditional brick-and-mortar education.

The Mississippi Department of Education (MDE) has contracted with Connections Education to operate the MVPS. Students throughout Mississippi now have access to Connections Education's innovative online courses and experienced, responsive teachers.

A student is limited to 2 Carnegie units per school year through this program. Registration for courses is completed through an on-site coordinator at the local public high school. Participation in this program is determined by each district. To find out if this program is being sponsored in your area, contact the local public high school or district central office.



MISSISSIPPI ONLINE COURSE APPLICATION DISTRICT GUIDANCE

The Mississippi Department of Education allows for local education agencies to offer courses through distance and online learning as outlined in State Board Policy Part 3, Chapter 56, Rule 56.1 - Distance Learning / Online Courses (Rule 56.1). In accordance with Rule 56.1, courses offered through the Mississippi Virtual Public School (MVPS), the Mississippi Interactive Video Network (MIVN), or MDE-approved independent study programs do not require additional approval.

In order for a vendor to be approved for use under paragraph 2 of Rule 56.1, local school districts must submit an application to the Mississippi Department of Education for approval to ensure the vendor/provider's content, curriculum, and assessments are aligned to "Mississippi College- and Career-Readiness Standards".

Districts must submit a **Mississippi Online Course Application (MOCA)** that includes a review of proposed distance and online courses. The evaluation rubric is derived from the Southern Regional Education Board's (SREB) *Checklist for Evaluating Online Courses* and the International Association for K-12 Online Learning's (iNOCAL) *National Standards for Quality Online Courses*.

School districts must complete an initial review of courses being proposed for use as distance and online courses. A district may work with other districts to submit a MOCA when multiple districts plan to offer courses provided by the same vendor.

A district online course review team must be comprised of a minimum of three (3) reviewers, to include at least two (2) content specialists (classroom teachers, curriculum specialists) and one (1) technology specialist to complete the review.

The MOCA shall include three (3) components: (1) the Application Cover and Signed Assurances, (2) the Online Course Review Rubric, and (3) the Online Course Alignment Crosswalk.

Completed MOCAs will be submitted electronically for final review and approval by the Mississippi Department of Education. The completed application, including the three required files, must be submitted via a single email to onlinecourses@mdek12.org.

The Mississippi Department of Education will review applications and notify districts of approval status, as outlined in the approval timeline below.

Once a course has been reviewed and approved by the MDE, the course will be added to a master list of approved online courses for use by other districts.

Credit Recovery Guidelines

DESCRIPTOR TERM: Credit Recovery

Policy RULE: 28.5

ADOPTION DATE:

May 19, 2008 REVISION:

The purpose of the credit recovery policy is to provide guidance to Local Education Agencies (LEAs) with Credit Recovery Programs. Credit recovery allows students who have been unsuccessful in mastering content or skills an opportunity to apply for credit recovery as an alternative to repeating the entire course.

- I. Credit recovery is defined as a course-specific, skill-based learning opportunity for students who have previously been unsuccessful in mastering content/skills required to receive course credit or earn promotion. In order to be eligible for credit recovery, a student must have unsuccessfully completed and failed a course or failed a SATP assessment.
- II. Beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, any LEA who provides a Credit Recovery Program shall develop and implement a Credit Recovery Program that has been adopted by the school board and that includes rules, regulations, and processes. The rules, regulations, and processes shall be available to faculty, students, and parents/guardians. At a minimum, LEAs must address the following areas:
 1. Admission to and removal from the Credit Recovery Program
 - a) LEAs shall establish an application process that requires parental consent.
 - b) LEAs shall establish minimum criteria to determine eligibility for participation in the Credit Recovery Program.
 - c) LEAs shall determine the number of Credit Recovery Courses that a student can take at one time.
 - d) Students shall not remain in a Credit Recovery Course for more than one year.
 - e) Only students that have failed a course may enroll in credit recovery to earn a minimum passing grade. Credit recovery cannot be used by a student that has passed the course to improve the students assigned course grade.

- f) A student that has passed a SATP class but failed the SATP assessment may enroll in credit recovery for remediation only. The grade earned for the SATP class remains unchanged.

- a) LEAs shall determine the instructional methodology used for the Credit Recovery Program (i.e., online program, Mississippi Virtual Public School (MVPS), direct instruction, computer assisted instruction, etc.).
 - b) If an online credit recovery program is used, the online delivery must be supervised by a licensed teacher employed by the LEA that issues the final credit recovery grade. The LEA must ensure that content and instruction is aligned to the Mississippi College and Career Ready Standards and the Mississippi Curriculum Frameworks.
 - c) LEAs shall provide professional development for teachers and facilitators involved with the Credit Recovery Program.
3. Content and Curriculum: Credit Recovery Curriculum shall be based on the Mississippi Curriculum Frameworks competencies and objectives.
4. Grades: LEAs are responsible for establishing specific procedures for evaluation of student progress and determining grades.
5. **Beginning school year 2016-2017, a student who selects credit recovery to earn a Carnegie unit shall only earn the minimum passing grade on the district grading scale.**

Official Guidance for Dual Credit Process

A **dual credit student** is a student who is enrolled in a CJC or IHL while enrolled in high school and who is receiving *high school credit* and *college credit* for postsecondary coursework.

A **dual enrolled student** is a student who is enrolled in a community or junior college (CJC) or state institution of higher learning (IHL) while enrolled in high school.

Students must meet all of the following eligibility criteria in either Option One or Option Two as agreed upon by the CJC to be eligible to take **academic** general education courses as dual credit/dual enrollment:

- Option One: Students may be admitted to this dual enrollment/dual credit program with a minimum overall 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale on all high school courses and with successful completion of 14 core high school units and/or high school junior status. Each student seeking admission to the program must submit an unconditional written recommendation from his/her high school principal or guidance counselor.
- Option Two: Students may also be admitted to the dual enrollment/dual credit program with a minimum of an overall 3.0 GPA on all high school courses and a minimum composite ACT score of 30 or the equivalent SAT score. Each student seeking admission to the program must submit an unconditional written recommendation from his/her high school principal or guidance counselor.
- A semester's worth of credit for academic general education courses is defined as 15 credit hours for the CJC. Developmental education courses **cannot** be taken for dual credit. Local placement scores will be used to determine college-readiness placement.

Students enrolled in eligible CTE courses may have different requirements. For more information, contact the CTE office at (601) 359-3461.

NOTE 1: The courses eligible for dual credit are determined by the IHLs and CJC in collaboration with the MDE. The "Dual Credit" list includes college course titles. If there are questions about course eligibility, please refer them to the IHL or CJC in which the high school student will be dually enrolled. Only the courses designated as "Dual Credit" will be available for students to earn dual credit. Each 3 hour college course will count for 1 full Carnegie unit. **There is no longer a need to develop course content equivalents between high school courses and college courses.** LEAs shall determine how to apply Carnegie units earned through dual credit courses toward high school graduation requirements based on the content area of the postsecondary course. Carnegie unit credit will be indicated on the high school transcript.

NOTE 2: All dual credit courses must be specified in an agreement BETWEEN THE HIGH SCHOOL AND THE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION. The agreement shall detail how issues of tuition and fees, transportation, instructional personnel, materials and sites, academic progress monitoring, and grade documentation will be resolved between the LEAs and the IHLs/CJCs. A suggested template is provided in this section. **School districts must use the dual credit course codes located in this manual for tracking dual credit course enrollment for the state accountability system. Any dual credit course taken by a student not in this course code manual will not be counted in the state accountability results for a school or district.**

NOTE 3: All course codes in the areas of Dual Credit, Correspondence, Mississippi Virtual Public School (MVPS), and Distance Learning have “NONE” indicated for the endorsement. The “NONE” endorsement indicator means that the school entering the information in the Mississippi Student Information System (MSIS) is not responsible for providing the certified teacher for the course, but rather the certified teacher is provided by another school/district for distance learning, by the MDE for MVPS, and by the postsecondary institution for dual credit. In some cases, the postsecondary institution may approve a local high school teacher to teach the postsecondary course eligible for dual credit. For a listing of online courses available through the MVPS, you may also visit <http://www.mdek12.org/PN/VPS>.

Early College High School - A small, independent high school that is usually located on a partnering college campus or a location other than a traditional high school campus. The students must go through an application process, entering as Freshmen, and all eligible students are selected by random lottery. The goal of an early college high school is for students to graduate with both a high school diploma and an associate’s degree from the partnering college. At the least, all members of the cohort should graduate from high school meeting the ACT or SAT Mississippi standards for admission to college without remediation and earn college credits while in high school.

Middle College Program – A middle college program is a robust dual credit/dual enrollment program run by a school district (or individual high school) and a partnering college that offers high school students a large choice of dual credit and dual enrollment classes. Upper classmen (11th and 12th graders) are encouraged to take as many DC/DE classes in a liberal-arts, pre-IHL program or a career-oriented program of study as possible. These students are supported by a strong high school/transitional counselor and are monitored closely to ensure that they are meeting college academic expectations. Transportation is usually provided by the district. The students may spend a portion of the academic day at the high school and a portion at the partnering community college, where the classes are taught. These programs are often set up in a cohort model.

**Mississippi Department of Education
Dual Credit/Dual Enrollment Agreement Guidance**

This guidance is provided with reference to sections 37-15-38 and 37-15-39, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, in order to revise and clarify the provisions relating to dual enrolled students and dual credit students.

What is a dual enrolled student?

A dual enrolled student is a student who is enrolled in a community or junior college or state institution of higher learning while enrolled in high school.

What is a dual credit student?

A dual credit student is a student who is enrolled in a community or junior college or state institution of higher learning while enrolled in high school and who is receiving high school and college credit for postsecondary coursework.

Who is eligible for dual credit courses?

Before credits earned by a qualified high school student from a community or junior college or state institution of higher learning may be transferred to the student's home school district, the student must be properly enrolled in a dual enrollment program.

Students must meet the following eligibility criteria:

The Boards of Trustees of the Community and Junior College (CJC) Districts and the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL) may recommend to the State Board of Education admission criteria for dual enrollment programs under which high school students may enroll at a community or junior college or university while they are still attending high school and enrolled in high school courses. Students may be admitted to enroll in community or junior college courses under the dual enrollment programs if they meet that individual institution's stated dual enrollment admission requirements.

The following components must be contained at a minimum in the school district's agreement:

- A ratification of articulation agreements between the CJC/IHL and the school district by the local school board.
- Courses and programs available to students eligible to participate in dual credit, including a plan for the CJC/IHL to provide guidance services in:
 - The process by which parents and students are notified of the option to participate (i.e., inclusion in the student handbook).
 - The process by which students and parents exercise their option to participate. It is important that parents and students understand the concept of academic control and responsibility. The high school is not the responsible party for monitoring of the student's academic performance at the CJC/IHL.
 - High school credits earned for completion of a dual credit course.
 - High school graduation requirements met through completion of dual credit courses.
 - Eligibility criteria for student participation in dual credit courses and programs.
 - Institutional responsibilities for student screening prior to enrollment, and monitoring of enrolled students.
 - Institutional and/or school district responsibilities for the cost of dual credit courses and programs.
 - Responsibility for providing student transportation. It is important to stipulate the responsible party for transporting students to the college campus.
- Mechanisms and strategies for promoting "Career and Technical Education" programs of study.

Dual Credit Courses Approved through MDE

The MDE shall make available a listing of dual credit course titles that will match the course titles available for dual credit at the CJC/IHLs in Mississippi. These course titles will correspond to the college level courses offered and taught at the CJC/IHLs. The listing will be developed and amended by the CJC/IHLs. These courses will be available to be accepted in lieu of courses required for graduation and elective credit. If a student takes dual credit for Biology I, Algebra I, English II, and U.S. History the student must take the corresponding end-of-course exam and meet the assessment requirements for graduation.

Postsecondary level developmental or intermediate courses shall not be considered as meeting the requirements of the dual credit program. A university or community or junior college shall make the final decision on what courses are eligible for semester hour credits. The Carnegie units awarded for the dual credit courses will be indicated in the Approved Courses Manual each year.

High School Carnegie Unit Equivalency

One (1) three-hour university or community or junior college course is equal to one (1) high school Carnegie unit.

Helpful Hints

A strong dual enrollment/credit agreement protects both the students and the institutions, provides win-win solutions to financial challenges, and allows for maximum access. Districts that report the greatest satisfaction with their dual enrollment/credit programs typically have successfully negotiated the following:

- **Tuition Responsibility**

For a pure dual credit course, each entity can contribute toward the cost of the instructor. While all articulation agreements must address this important element, it is important to be flexible and exercise latitude in providing for educational opportunities. In many cases, local school districts and college partners may negotiate to waive the cost of classes or students could be required to pay tuition cost sufficient to cover the costs of a teacher. Also, some agreements stipulate that if a student elects to take a course at a CJC/IHL, then the cost of the course will be assumed by the parent unless state appropriated, private or grant funds are available. It should be noted that a good mix of community college instructors and high school teachers provide for a balance in the funds paid out and those received.

- **Textbook Adoption Timetables**

While school districts are responsible for the purchase of their students' textbooks, the two entities can come to an agreement on a reasonable length of time for the use of "class sets" of dual credit textbooks. If for example, districts can be guaranteed use of a set of textbooks for 3 years from the time of purchase, the enormous cost associated with textbooks can be greatly diminished. In addition, parties could negotiate in the local agreements to utilize the same texts and when there is a desire to use a different text, it would become the responsibility of that party to purchase selected texts. With the exception of those areas with rapidly changing technology (which can be specified in the agreement), most academic texts can be used effectively for much longer than they typically are used. Though this may involve compromise on the part of the instructors, it does not compromise the quality or integrity of the course.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT****BETWEEN****_____ SCHOOL DISTRICT AND _____ COLLEGE**

In furtherance of our mutual objectives to enhance and improve educational opportunities for students in Mississippi, and in accordance with Mississippi law, the _____ School District (henceforth known as “the school district”) and _____ College (henceforth known as “the college”) enter into this articulation agreement on the following terms.

This dual enrollment/dual credit program may include courses taught at the college, courses taught at district high schools and online. In all cases, courses offered for dual credit will meet the content standards of the faculty of the college. The college will have final approval of all instructors of courses for which college credit will be awarded. Students enrolled in the school district and admitted to the *dual enrollment* program will be eligible to enroll in all courses offered by the college for which they qualify. Academic *dual credit* will be limited to the approved Mississippi Community and Junior College course list.

Students participating in the dual enrollment/credit program are required by the college to meet eligibility requirements and prerequisites for college courses. Most commonly, course placement is accomplished through a review of ACT scores and/or completion of placement tests. The college will determine prerequisites and appropriate placement test criteria for college courses.

To facilitate student participation in this program and to ensure that this program meets student needs, the following steps will be taken:

- **Definitions:**

- A **Dual Enrolled Student** is a student who is enrolled in a community or junior college or state institution of higher learning while enrolled in high school. The student receives only postsecondary credit for coursework.
- A **Dual Credit Student** is a student who is enrolled in a community or junior college or state institution of higher learning while enrolled in high school and who is receiving both high school and college credit for postsecondary coursework. The student receives credit for coursework regardless of the course location (high school campus, postsecondary campus, or online). One three-hour postsecondary course is equal to one high school Carnegie unit.
- **Notification:** Students who are eligible to participate in this program, as well as their parents, will be made aware of the option to participate during each registration period. It is important that all stakeholders understand the concept of academic control, responsibility, and Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) requirements. The high school is not the responsible party for monitoring of the student's academic performance at the postsecondary institution.
- **Participation:** High school students who are interested in program participation should contact the designated dual enrollment/dual credit liaison at their school. The liaison will advise interested students of the eligibility requirements and the procedure for enrolling in the dual enrollment/dual credit program. Program participation will require submission to the college of a completed application for admission and transcript with ACT scores noted. Once formally admitted to the college, students will register for the dual enrollment/credit classes.
- **Eligibility Criteria Recommendation:**
 - Students may be admitted to the academic dual enrollment/dual credit program with the following criteria:
 - (1) a minimum overall 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale on all high school courses and with successful completion of 14 core high school units as listed and defined in Appendix B of the Mississippi Public School Accountability Standards
 - OR

(2) Students may also be admitted to the dual enrollment/dual credit program with a minimum of an overall 3.0 GPA on all high school courses and a minimum composite ACT score of 30 or the equivalent SAT score.

(3) Each student seeking admission to this program must submit an unconditional written recommendation from his/her high school principal or guidance counselor.

- **Evaluation:** All courses and programs offered by the college will meet the standards established as part of the institution's SACSCOC accreditation as well as any other specialized accreditations that may apply.
- **Cost:** Tuition charges and other costs for college courses are the responsibility of the parents or legal guardians of participating students unless these costs are covered by grants, scholarships, or the school district. Regardless of the source of payment, all levied charges and fees must be paid directly to the college. Student grades will not be released to the school district until all student debts are paid in full. Tuition charges for students participating in this program will be reviewed annually and, if changes are made, notice will be given to the school district before classes begin. Students are responsible for acquisition of textbooks or online fees.
- **Transportation:** Students, their parents or legal guardians are responsible for arranging transportation for courses taught at sites away from the high school campus.

Once ratified, this agreement shall remain in effect until further notice. Cancellation of this agreement may be effected by either party by giving 30 days written notice to the other. No changes may be made to the conditions of this agreement without the written consent of both parties.
