Gaylord Solem - The Life and Times of a Car Salesman

When you have a job you love and are able to meet, help and just plain visit with thousands of people, you have had the opportunity of a lifetime. Add to that, you have attended a small school, raised a family and have worked in that same area all your life. In a nutshell, those two statements describe the life experience of 1955 Oslo High School graduate Gaylord Solem, who has been employed at Dahlstrom Motors in Oslo for just a few months short of 60 years. What follows is a more detailed description of the life and times of Gaylord Solem, recordbreaking car salesman.

He was born into the William and Esther (Olson) Solem family at St. Michael's Hospital in Grand Forks, ND. As the youngest child, he joined brothers Donald, Elton and Ralph and sister Ila. They lived on a farm one mile east and six miles south of Oslo. All attended the Lakeside School seven miles south of Oslo. Lakeside was a one-room country school which had 1st through 8th grades with 36 students, which he attended for six years. Some of his country school memories are when he was in the 6th grade, their teacher would have them take the 1st graders to the back of the room and work with them on numbers and speaking. "It was something for us to do and a way to help out the teacher." The school was a mile and a half from their home. "In the winter, if it was 25 degrees below zero or colder, our dad would hook up the horses and give us a ride to school, otherwise we walked every day.

His most enjoyable memory from country school was once a year in the spring, three country schools - Lakeside, Esther Township School and Tabor Township School and Tabor
Township School would get together
and have a play day. They would all
enjoy softball, track, running and
jumping. "That was the really high
point of the year."

"When we were in 6th grade, our
Lakeside school district decided to send

the 7th and 8th graders to a new school. It would be either Alvarado or Oslo. My father fought against sending us kids to

Alvarado, because we all wanted to go to Oslo. But my best friends lived on the other side of the line so they went to Alvarado - about 5 of us went to Oslo. So, from 7th grade to our senior year, we were in competition with each

When asked what his favorite junior high story from Oslo was, he replied with a big grin, "The day I scored every point for Oslo in a basketball game in the 7th grade! I'd never seen a basketball before. I'd never held a basketball or shot one until that day when the superintendent came to the classroom and pointed to me and 6 other boys in the 7th grade and said "You are dressing for the B basketball game." At half-time, Minto led us 21-0. I scored 2 free throws in the second half. And I tell all my kids how great I was to score all the points in the game!! But I don't tell them the final score."

Another favorite memory for Gaylord was meeting his future wife, Patricia Michalski or Patty, in eighth grade. They were in many of the same classes and when Gaylord was a sophomore he and Patty started dating. They dated all through high school and got married on June 23, 1956, after Patty graduated.

Gaylord liked geometry and bookkeeping, and has always been good with numbers. Mrs. Feste, the bookkeeping teacher, was one of his favorite teachers. He was the only boy among 20 girls and according to his wife, Patty, he was the teacher's pet!

She was in the same class.

"I played basketball and baseball in high school. After the split of the country school, my best friends played baseball for Alvarado and, of course, I played for Oslo, so we ended up being competitors and neighbors all through junior and senior high. During one of those years, Alvarado had a very good baseball team, they were 10-1 for the year and we didn't have a very good team that year, we were 2-10. We ended up playing them in the tournament and beat them 26-7! That caused some hard feelings with some of the neighbors, but we all worked through it." Gaylord graduated from Oslo High School in 1955 with 17 in his graduating class. At that time, the kids from the North Dakota side of the river were attending school in Oslo, too. Patty graduated the next year in 1956. After Patty graduated, they got married in Oslo and have lived there ever since. Patty laughs saying, "We didn't go too

When asked "What are some experiences from your youth that helped prepare you for life?", they each had a story to tell.

Gaylord replied, "My dad died in 1951, when I was 13. We had eight milk cows at the time that had to be milked at 5:30 in the morning and 6 o'clock in the evening. My mother, sister and I would milk those cows in the morning. I'd go to the barn at 5:30 and go straight from the barn to the bus at 7:30 and off to school. We never even got a chance to go back into the house and clean up before getting on the bus." If you've ever been involved in milking cows, you know what he's talking about when he says "straight from the barn to the bus." My mother told me that in 1947 the farm's gross income was \$900. That's why I moved off the farm and started working in town after graduating from high school.

Patty's reply to that question was, "I lost my mother in my teens; she passed away when I was 15. My mother would fix my favorite food, which was chili, every day for my lunch. We lived right behind the school, so I always went home for lunch. The day after mother's funeral, I was walking home from school for lunch and could see a figure sitting on the back step of my house. I knew that it couldn't be my mother, but I could not figure out who it was. As I got closer and closer, I realized it was my Auntie Maude. She had made a pot of chili for me and came to visit so I didn't have to go home to an empty house." That loving experience in life has clearly made Patty a very caring and compassionate person. Patty has sung in the choir and played the piano and organ for St. Joseph Church for many years. She volunteers and plays for many senior organizations and enjoys getting out and being with others. Patty taught piano lessons for over 42 years with approximately 42

students a year.
Gaylord's first paying job was during his sophomore, junior and senior summers working in Oslo. "Halbert Lofthus, a carpenter, hired me to be his helper. I started my first full time job for Dahlstrom Motors May 10, 1956." He's still working there full time today. "I was the bookkeeper, parts man, shop foreman and some sales. There were a total of four employees at that time. My total wages were \$175 month. I would go to work at 5:30 a.m. to do the book work, then go to the shop and write up all of the shop orders. The crew back then was Bobby Jamieson, Ray Durkin, Bob Dahlstrom and me, all Oslo residents. Now the business has grown, we currently have 35 employees. When Dahlstrom Motors first opened, it was located where it is now, though they have expanded and added buildings and lots. There was a filling station there also, but it closed in 1955." Gaylord has been a part of the Dahlstrom Motors team for nearly 60

The 60s and the 80s were the toughest years for car dealerships. Many of the surrounding area dealerships closed, some in Warren, Argyle, Stephen, Drayton, and Minto, and other small towns in the area. In those years, the car dealerships started to lose financially. DMC was lucky to hang on through those tough years; and is the only new car dealer in Marshall

While working at DMC, Gaylord also was the Oslo City Clerk from 1959-1963 and served as a member of the Oslo City Council from 1959-1974. He heľped work on many projects for the city during those years. One of those projects was the start of the temporary and permanent dike systems. The residents and businesses of Oslo dealt with flooding for decades. The whole town was flooded in 1965, as it had been many springs in the past and Gaylord and Patty had one of the only houses in Oslo that didn't get flooded. He showed a picture of their house and there was just a little bit of ground surrounding the house sticking up out of the flood water. He boated the 5 blocks to work. The temporary dike surrounding Oslo and adjoining land was started in 1966 and it turned into a permanent dike in 1971 when the Army Corps of Engineers approved it. Also during his tenure as City Council member, in 1961 water distribution was put in to replace the use of cisterns and wells and the sanitary sewer was done a few years later. Those are the three big projects for the improvement of the City of Óslo that he's most proud of being a

When asked what changes he's seen in the car industry, he mentioned a few. The biggest changes would be the prices. "Back in 1957, I heard people comment that they would never buy a new car if it cost over \$2,000. Now many of the new vehicles cost up to \$40,000 to \$50,000 with an option to take out a seven year car loan. People tell me they are paying more for their new vehicle than they paid for their house with a 40 year mortgage. And they are still paying on their house!" The integration of computers is another (Continued on page 5)

Warren Area Community Fund Promotes Warren Progress

The Warren Area Community Fund (WACF) was established to help the greater Warren community address challenges and opportunities central to its future. It is a tool for positive change through investment.

Through the years, WACF has made donations to various entities to enhance the local quality of life, such organizations as the Education Foundation, Audubon Sanctuary, county historical society, the school, county fair association, the Legion, the city, child care facility and others.

Currently, WACF is committed to providing funding for improvements to the Warren Swimming Pool area,

(the pool is 50 years old). Those improvements are to be in two phases: phase 1 is a new bathhouse with restroom and shower facilities to be available 12 months, and phase 2 is a multi-generational recreation center attached to the bathhouse to be used 12 months out of the year for those young and old. It is estimated phase 1 could cost \$135,000-\$150,000, depending on amenities, and phase 2 up to \$500,000, again depending on amenities.
