4 Secretary with the minutes? Scott Campbell stated that it has helped.

14 **12. BOARD OF EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORTS**

15  
16 **Budget & Finance** – Robyn Glocker Hammond stated that the ad for the  
17 professional appointments will be posted in the newspaper this Saturday. Patrick  
18 Lani asked what newspaper we will be using and Scott Campbell replied that  
19 we will use the Gloucester County Times. Mrs. Glocker Hammond also stated  
20 that the committee will be meeting again next week at a time to be established  
21 later on this evening.

22  
23 **Buildings & Grounds** – Fred Reel stated that he called John Gibson this  
24 morning and asked him if he got our grant application. He said Mr. Gibson told  
25 him that they extended the time and we did get the application in time prior to the  
26 extension. He also said that there is a possibility we could get the money but he  
27 will let Mr. Reel know in about a month.

28  
29 **Personnel Committee** – Michael Myers stated that the committee met with the  
30 Superintendent and will be going into closed session this evening to discuss the  
31 Business Administrator's contract.

32  
33 **13. PUBLIC - AGENDA/NON-AGENDA ITEMS**

34  
35 This is the time when anyone from the public who wishes to speak to the Board  
36 may do so. Please state your name, address and phone number. The Board will  
37 hear your concerns. The Board may or may not take action this evening. You  
38 will be notified either at this meeting, by letter or telephone of any action the  
39 Board does take.

40  
41 **Lee Lucas**, 361 Democrat Road, Gibbstown, NJ talked about the consolidation  
42 report that is due in March 2010. He said the state is going to submit a report on  
43 their recommendations and it is his opinion that they will want Greenwich  
44 Township to merge with the Paulsboro School District because they want to  
45 eliminate all K-8 districts. It will have to go to a public referendum which will be a

1 special election in September 2010. **Mr. Lucas** is against merging with  
2 Paulsboro because they have too many fiscal problems. It is his belief that the  
3 ratables are not that good and we will not benefit from merging with Paulsboro.  
4 He stated we also need to start watching our per pupil costs. According to the  
5 newspaper, we are the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest in three counties. He feels that the dispute  
6 has nothing to do with two buildings. We should look at how many teachers  
7 aides there are and maybe cut back on that since it would also cut back on  
8 benefits.

9 **Mr. Lucas** asked Patrick Lani what item E on page 5 was about. **Mr. Lani** said  
10 he assumed it is a program that is set up for parents to voluntarily participate in.  
11 **Mr. Lucas** asked what program is it that they would be participating in? **Mr. Lani**  
12 said it had to do with ADD problems. **Mr. Lucas** said the Board Members should  
13 better understand what they are voting for before they vote. **Mr. Lani** asked **Mr.**  
14 **Lucas** if he knew what it was about and **Mr. Lucas** said he is not privy to that  
15 information because he is not a board member.

16 **Robert Suessmuth** commented that it is a resource program for our parents of  
17 students with Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD) or think their child may have ADD.  
18 It provides resources for parents where they can go for information and  
19 recommendations or advice so that they can decide what is best for their  
20 children.

21 **Mr. Lucas** stated that 15% on students are on some type of medicine. **Mr.**  
22 **Suessmuth** agrees that there is medication that is used for students with ADD—  
23 that is common knowledge. The more modern approach is not to use the  
24 medication but that is between the parent and the attending physician. We try to  
25 help the student before it gets to that point.

26 **Michael Myers** stated that we are not facilitating this but the overall responsibility  
27 to any child is on the parents. We would be wrong not to have this program for  
28 parents who would otherwise be paying a large sum of money to have the same  
29 participation. This isn't about the Board—this is about an individual parents  
30 responsibility to their child and what we are providing. Even if it helps just one kid  
31 that doesn't get straightened out otherwise regardless of what medicine they are  
32 on, is not our responsibility. **Mr. Myers** agrees that this program is a good thing  
33 and that is why he voted for it.

34 **Mr. Lucas** stated that he is not for putting kids on ADD drugs and he doesn't  
35 even believe that ADD even exists and that some kids just don't like school and  
36 are not well disciplined by their parents. He also stated that putting kids on drugs  
37 is child abuse.

38 **Patrick Lani** asked **Terri DiSanto**, Child Study Team Social Worker, about what  
39 the Child Study Team does for a child whom they think may need help? **Mrs.**  
40 **DiSanto** stated that her office just recommends parents to seek neurological  
41 testing. It is not something they require parents to do—it is not mandatory.

42 **Paula Carrozino**, 3<sup>rd</sup> grade teacher, Broad Street School, said she has two (2)  
43 students in the program with Children's Hospital and they do not take any  
44 medication.

1 **Patrick Lani** stated that the medication is only an option—not mandatory. **Mr.**  
2 **Lani** thanked Mr. Lucas for his time and comments.

3  
4 **Mr. Suessmuth** stated that our Board members attended a meeting at the  
5 County Office. A presentation was made on “Defining Consolidation of School  
6 Districts.” Regionalization is one...shared services is another.  
7 If it goes to regionalization, it will go to a vote in the form of a referendum.

8 **Mr. Myers** added that Gibbstown and Paulsboro, as a combined two districts, do  
9 not meet the criteria of a regionalization. There are not enough students to form a  
10 district by themselves. From what he got out of the meeting is that they are  
11 pushing for shared services and consolidation of jobs.

12 **Mr. Myers** stated that as long as the Gibbstown residents agree to pay what they  
13 pay on taxes, which are among the lowest taxes in the county, it will stay as is.  
14 Our test scores have always been among the highest in the county. We spent  
15 more money for our students but we have “smart” kids.

16  
17 **Rich Valentino**, 213 Crescent Avenue, Gibbstown, NJ observed on his job as a  
18 telephone technician that schools in Pennsylvania have dispensers with hand  
19 sanitizing gel that students use regularly. Do we have that in our schools?

20 **Patrick Lani** asked **Cathy Tortella**, Nehaunsey Middle School Nurse, for her  
21 input. **Mrs. Tortella** stated that there are dispensers in the cafeteria and also on  
22 each teacher’s desk and the students are encouraged to use them.

23
