A verse on my heart lately is, "I give thanks to God always on your account..." from 1 Corinthians 1:3.



Fulfilling our Mission

Although St. Theresa originally experienced some set backs due to the pandemic, STS has continued to meet and exceed our strategic goals.

One of those goals is to provide mental and financial support to our students and families. We are able to offer mental support via zoom with a licensed therapist to our parents and students. We are also able to better support our families financially by providing free breakfast and lunch this year. Praise God! We are thankful for ACE Scholarships, who generously donated over \$90,000 in scholarships. With their support, we are able to offer more scholarships to low income families.

Another goal is to better meet our technology needs for our teachers and students. Due to CARES ACT funds, we are now able to provide a Chromebook to every student in second through eighth grade! Every teacher was also able to receive a document camera. With these additions, we are able to better serve our students and are better prepared in case we need to be virtual again in the future.

Also through the help of CARES ACT Funds, we were able to meet our building needs. STS now has three water bottle refillable stations to help minimize the spread of germs. Through a partnership with City Serve in Little Rock, we received donations to help kickstart our bathroom remodel project. This included toilets, urinals, light fixtures, and sinks!

Our enrollment continues to rise throughout the year. Specifically, our waitlist for kindergarten and first grade continues to grow! We are very thankful for everyone who has referred our school to a family member or loved one. We are grateful that even in the midst of a pandemic, we continue to receive phone calls and drop-ins from prospective families.

Most importantly, our faith has remained strong and apparent at St. Theresa Catholic School. Our eighth graders continue to lead. They led our school rosary and set the example in mass for our younger students. Our students have, figuratively, linked arms more than ever before and shown compassion towards each other. They understand that these are hard times, and it truly warms my heart to see them be there for each other. They've had to deal with several changes this school year and they've taken them on like champs!
