PikMyKid Reminders – we have an amazing system, but it's important to use it correctly!

We've identified 3 important details related to PikMyKid that will help improve our dismissal process even more! No matter what your mode of pick up is, each family is reminded to:

- 1. **Announce Yourself** when you arrive on campus. This can be done starting at 2:30. A security feature of PikMyKid is that only persons designated by the parent can have access to each child's code. That is why the person picking up must press the green ANNOUNCE YOURSELF icon it let's school staff know you are approved for pickup. That is why school staff should not supply a code for you. The role of staff is only to give you a place in line.
- 2. Select the name of EACH of the children you are picking up. Teachers are monitoring the car line from the classroom. If a child's name does not appear on the screen, they won't be sent down. That can hold up the entire car line.
- 3. Make sure each child's primary mode of pick up is accurate each day: car line, walker, bus, after school. Car line is the default. However, you need to change the mode of pick up if you are using one of the other three options. Why is this important? If the name of a child who rides the PAL bus appears in the list for the car line, it creates confusion. Click here for directions on changing mode of pick up.

IF YOU WALK UP TO THE GYM AREA: You must still do all 3 of the steps above! No one may just walk up and ask for your child.

Dress Code Policy

The purpose of Guardian Catholic's dress code is to create an atmosphere that is conducive to learning. School uniforms and a uniform dress code promote learning, build a sense of community and improve school safety.

- ✓ Due to COVID-19 and school wide changes, we have revised the dress code shoe requirements in order for students to focus on getting acclimated to the changes in school.
- ✓ The intent was to keep all other requirements the same for **both** On-Campus and Distance Learners.
- ✓ Moving forward, we will be reinforcing our handbook dress code policy for all students whether they attend virtually or in person. (Attach handbook guidelines).
- ✓ Those who are in violation will have 3 verbal and written reminders before receiving a consequence.
