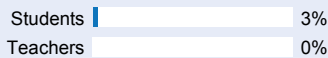

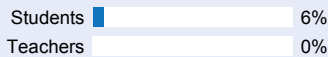

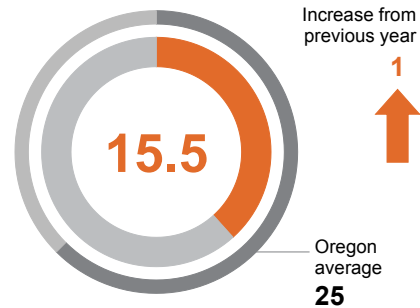

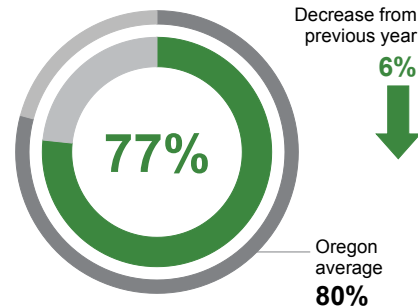
#### CLASS SIZE

#### REGULAR ATTENDERS

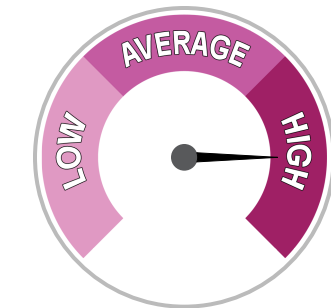
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

#### INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

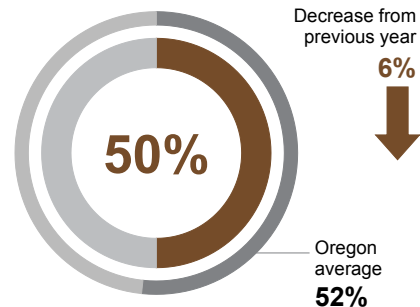
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

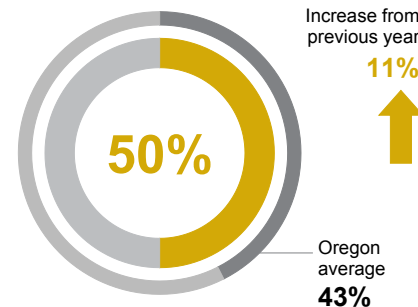
#### ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



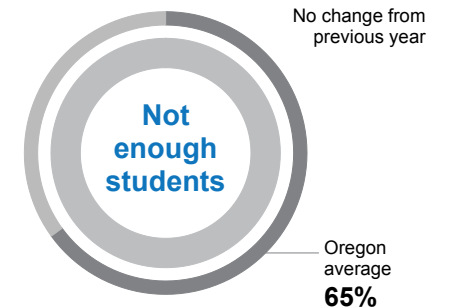
#### MATHEMATICS

### School Goals

Our mission statement: We are a community school committed to lifelong learning that enables our children to confidently reach their goals.

We strive to meet these goals by including the following academic supports and enrichments: Response to Intervention instruction, Special Education program, Friday Academy, Summer School, Talented and Gifted Program, Artist-in-Residence programs, OMSI school programs, and Outdoor School.

### State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is working in partnership with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

### Safe & Welcoming Environment

We started a Random Acts of Kindness Campaign that engaged students in reaching out to others and finding ways to show kindness to kick off a school-wide character focus.

We conduct monthly safety drills and take students through various scenarios to ensure all are prepared in the case of an emergency.

#### BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

We use Positive Behavior Support to foster meaningful learning opportunities for students' behavior and relationships with others. Students participate in the Hands Are Not For Hurting Project and Conflict Resolution/Peer Mediation as well.

#### EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES
