Recently we sent parents a digital survey regarding your interest in having children in grades 4-8 participate in intramural soccer after school or in volleyball on Saturdays. Reporting COVID-19

For COVID-19, a close contact is anyone who was within 6 feet of an infected person for at least 15 minutes. All reports are strictly confidential.
