Remote Learning Plan Overview

In response to the COVID-19 global health crisis, Rainier School District (RSD) has developed this comprehensive distance learning plan so our students can continue learning while our school buildings are closed. This plan represents RSD's commitment to making every effort to ensure the that learning of each student continues to be successful.

This plan is founded on the following principles: (1) supporting continuous instruction, (2) providing access for all students, and (3) flexibility for students and families.

Throughout building closures, RSD teachers will continue to provide students with instruction that is designed to build upon the learning trajectory already established in the classroom. They will do so using one of the three remote learning options identified in this plan:

- RSD's Online learning platform with live teacher support
- RSD's Virtual Learning platform with teacher monitoring
- Paper-based instruction &/or laptop without internet.



The options listed above are for comprehensive distance learning. We will review County and state metrics and are planning a hybrid and in-person learning plan as well. Additionally, bringing students in K-3 is a priority that we are working to plan as well. We all want to have students back as soon as possible and will do so when permitted. We will get through this together!

Rainier School District Learning Phases

Phase 1

Comprehensive Distance learning

All students are engaged in online learning. Instruction occurs remotely with very limited exceptions for in-person supports



Paper Based Learning

Students will receive paper versions of online instruction and assignments



OR


Available for 3rd-12th grade through Odysseyware, student directed and student paced.

All students have access to in-person instruction in accordance with public health requirements







Our Approach to Remote Learning

Equity as our core identity

Equity remains our foundational cornerstone for remote learning.

As such, RSD remains committed to a holistic approach to learning. In addition to academic support, RSD will continue to support families with their physical, mental, and emotional health needs during these unprecedented times. Flexibility for our students will also be a primary consideration as we enter into our comprehensive distance learning plan.



The Remote Learning Plan

Leverages distance learning to foster sustained student growth by:



SUPPORTING CONTINUOUS INSTRUCTION

RSD will continue to support instruction through a variety of digital and non-digital materials to support academic growth for our students. RSD will provide flexible learning options and will add additional options such as hybrid and inperson when state and local metrics deem it safe to do so.



PROVIDING ACCESS FOR ALL STUDENTS

RSD is committed to providing devices, resources for internet, and alternative access to curriculum. We are focusing on equity of access to learning for our students with disabilities, second language learners, and students facing barriers to learning.

Our district will continue to provide access to healthy meals, through pick-up or drop-off options.



FLEXIBILITY FOR STUDENTS AND FAMILIES

To support success for all, RSD will provide live sessions with minimal overlap. Sessions will present pre-recorded instructional videos that can be accessed anytime to provide flexibility that working parents require.

Students who do not attend the live session will be required to communicate with their teacher for attendance and support purposes.

OPTION 1

RSD's Online Learning Platform with live teacher support

- · Digital instructional materials are provided by the district
- · Live lessons are delivered by teachers
- · Students have the flexibility to log-in for live instruction, watch or re-watch the live instructional session, and attend live tutoring for extended hours.
- · Students access instruction directly from district-provided materials (e.g., district lesson plans, Engage NY).
- Teachers offer online office hours and/or web-based/telephone feedback for students and parents.
- REDESIGNED Google Classroom to provide a consistent learning platform.
- All classes will be graded and students will receive traditional grades.
- Attendance tracked (M, T, Th, F) through attendance in live session, phone conversation, and/or two-way email communication

Will my child be required to be in CDL (Online) all year?

NO! RSD is working on plans to open K-3 as soon as possible, followed by hybrid and/or in-person when metrics meet acceptable levels.



Options for Remote Learning

OPTION 2

RSD's Virtual Learning Platform monitored by a teacher.

- · Student-led instruction hosted through Odesseyware.
- Program available for 3-12 grade.
- · A model of instruction that can occur at any time kids independently selfpace their learning.
- Students are required to login daily for attendance purposes.
- Limited space available
- Apply online
- All classes will be graded and students will receive traditional grades.

How much teacher "face time" will my child receive?

This program is beneficial for students who are selfmotivated and need minimal teacher interaction. Teachers will monitor progress but will interact less frequently than option 1.



Options for Remote Learning

OPTION 3

Paper-based Instruction &/or laptop without internet.

- · Instruction for students without access to technology or internet.
- Teachers provide the same instruction as if your student was online.
- Students can have access to pre-recorded lessons through a Chromebook and flash drive with weekly materials saved.
- · Paper-materials (or flash drives) can be picked-up/dropped-off at the district weekly.
- · Students required to be in regular contact with teacher through phone or other means.
- All classes will be graded and students will receive traditional grades.

What if I can't pick-up/drop-off materials for my child?

Special accommodations can be arranged if there is no ability to come to the school. We will make sure every child has their individual obstacles to learning removed!



Best Practices for Remote Learning

General Guidance

- PRIMARY GOAL: Provide students with opportunities to continue their learning whether in comprehensive distance learning, a hybrid model, or in-person. This should consist of providing students with access to content, support, and feedback.
- ESTABLISH STRUCTURE: Begin by orienting students and families to the new environment and creating structure with a focus on maintaining human interaction.
- CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT: Maintain a focus on continuous improvement. Practices should evolve and improve as we continue to learn and as metrics change.
- SUPPORTING TEACHERS: School leaders should work to ensure all teachers have the resources, support, and flexibility needed to promote student learning to the best of their ability. Support should include providing our teachers with professional development and resources that are accessed on-campus.
- SUPPORTING STUDENTS AND FAMILIES: Teachers should be flexible regarding expectations and processes for student learning, with an understanding that online learning conditions will vary across students.

Special Education Guidance

- According to Federal guidance from the Office of Special Education, the Office for Civil Rights, and the Oregon Department of Education, if a district closes its schools to slow or stop the spread of COVID-19, and continues to provide educational opportunities to general education student populations, the schools must ensure that students with disabilities also have equal access to the same opportunities. Included in this requirement, schools must implement the IEP of a student with a disability to the greatest extent possible. This means every attempt possible has been tried and documented to ensure equitable access for students with a disability.
- RSD is committed to Equity, and this includes services and programs for students with disabilities. The special education department will develop a schedule for students in addition to providing access to a live help desk for additional support and tutoring.

Roles in Supporting Remote Learning

Students

STUDENTS WILL PREPARE FOR REMOTE LEARNING BY:

- ✓ Engaging in remote learning activities being offered by their teachers, school and/or the district.
- Ensuring that they know the usernames and passwords for instructional resources that are accessible via the district portal and/or website.
- Ensuring they set up a remote work space and calendar to manage their time.
- ✓ Plan to spend 3-4 hours a day between class and applied learning.
- ✓ Wednesdays are scheduled for make-up work, applied learning, tutoring, and social Emotional Learning.
- ✓ Submit daily assignments on-time.
- ✓ Communicate with teacher at least 4 times per week.

Families

FAMILIES WILL PREPARE FOR REMOTE LEARNING BY:

- ✓ Assuring that a device and internet access are available at home.
- ✓ Ensuring that they are monitoring District communication for up-to-date information regarding school closures and instructional continuation plans on RSD website or Facebook pages.
- Encouraging their students' participation in remote learning content.
- Reviewing the appropriate grade-level information linked within the District website.
- Ensuring that they know their students' usernames and passwords for instructional resources that are accessible via the District portal and/or this website.
- Review instructional tutorials available on RSD website.

Roles in Supporting Remote Learning

Teachers

TEACHERS WILL PREPARE FOR REMOTE LEARNING BY:

- ✓ Teaching on-site to provide excellent and consistent instruction with technology support.
- Preparing standard-aligned weekly lesson and student plans.
- Providing instructional resources and materials through remote means such as Google Classroom and Google Meet.
- ✓ Reviewing district-supplied remote learning materials.
- ✓ Setting office hours to connect with students and support their learning remotely.
- Participating in group professional learning intended to support remote learning.
- Ensuring that they are monitoring District communication for up-to-date information.

Leaders

LEADERS WILL PREPARE FOR REMOTE LEARNING BY:

- Providing socio-emotional support and an overall positive remote school culture.
- ✓ Reviewing weekly lesson/student plans.
- ✓ Supporting teachers to provide instructional resources and materials through remote means such as Google Classroom and Google Meet.
- ✓ Reviewing district-supplied remote learning materials.
- ✓ Setting office hours and weekly live session to connect with parents to support remote learning for students.
- ✓ Participating in leader professional learning sessions intended to support leading in a remote environment.
- Ensuring that they are monitoring District communication for up-to-date information regarding RSD learning program.

A Holistic Approach



At RSD, we are committed to providing equitable and inclusive environments which is in alignment with our goal of support for the Whole Child.

THIS IS SUPPORTED DURING COMPREHENSIVE DISTANCE LEARNING BY:

- Use of Culturally Responsive Education and Social Emotional Academic Learning best practices and resources
- Printing and providing paper-based learning to students as we work to ensure 100% device access
- Developing robust plans to address unfinished learning
- Providing resources to educators on trauma informed remote environments

Plan for No Technology Access

If one or multiple of the Learning Management Systems crash...

All District Provided Instructional Materials are available through the school office and can be emailed by teacher if requested. If you cannot access Google Classroom or Odysseyware, please call or email your teacher at your earliest convenience.

If a student does not have access to technology...

While we are working to ensure all students have access to technology, we realize this will not be the reality for every student. In the event that technology is not available, we would ask that paper-based learning materials be picked up at the school or contact the office if you need help getting them to you.

If technology is available but internet is not, students can receive a Chromebook and flash drive with weekly lessons uploaded. This will enable students to access learning materials electronically and should not require internet.

- · Meal Delivery throughout the district
- · Oregon Expanded Income Guideline (EIG) (FREE Lunch Eligibility)
 - o The State of Oregon has increased the income guidelines for free meal eligibility in the 2020-21 school year from 185% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) to 300% FPL. To receive meals at no charge under Oregon's expanded free meal eligibility, families would submit their household income information using the 2020-21 Confidential Family Application for Free & December 2020-21 Reals.
