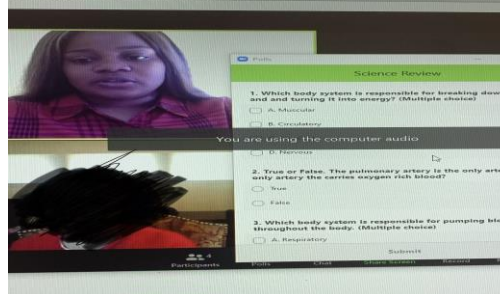

Administrator's Message

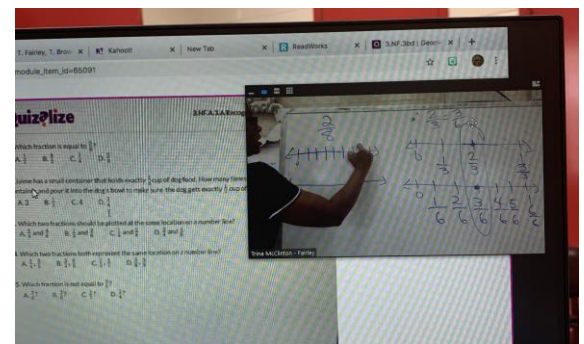

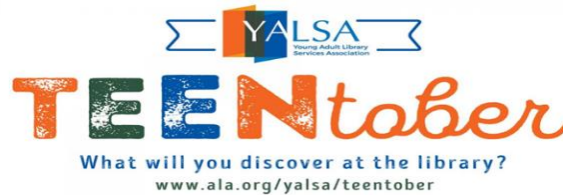
