Mathematics: Mrs. Pinkerton and Mrs. Coleman <u>SKILLS:</u>

We will work on these standards:

<u>4.0A.3 Solve multi-step word problems posed with answers using the four operations(including whole numbers). Represent these problems using equations with a letter standing for an unknown quantity. Assess the reasonableness of answers using estimation strategies.</u>

_We will continue practicing word problems that involve more than one step to solve. Our workbook has quite a few lessons on this as it is a difficult concept for many students. Students will be instructed to read carefully and they will be given help finding words in the problem that 'tell' us what operations are involved. We will also be focused on what it means when there is a remainder when we divide. Example: If 14 people need a ride to the festival, and only 4 people can ride in a car, how many cars will they need to take?

<u>Social Studies</u> - Chapter 5 Ohio as America - Ohio's Ancient American Indians Standards Addressed :

1. The order of significant events in Ohio and the United States can be shown on a timeline.
