Dear Parents/Guardians:

On Friday, Tatum ISD received confirmation that four students and a staff member who attend Tatum High School tested positive for COVID-19. The students and staff member were last on campus on Wednesday November 11th and Thursday November 12, 2020. You are receiving this notice because your child was present on the campus prior to the student's diagnosis of COVID-19.

The district will follow cleaning protocols to ensure that the area is sanitised and safe for staff and students.

While we do not have reason to believe that those who were not in close contact with the infected individuals have reason to be concerned, we ask that you, as always, watch for symptoms of COVID-19.

Any of the symptoms below indicate a possible COVID-19 infection:

- Feeling feverish or a measured temperature greater than or equal to 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit
- Loss of taste or smell
- Cough
- Difficulty breathing
- Shortness of breath
- Fatigue
- Headache
- Chills
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Shaking or exaggerated shivering
- Significant muscle pain or ache
- Diarrhea
- Nausea or vomiting

If you or any member of your family begins experiencing any of these symptoms in a way that is not typical, we encourage you to contact your physician. We encourage anyone who is lab-confirmed to have COVID-19 to please notify the school.
