High School and a New Milford resident said the teachers clerk positions should be added back in next year's budget. Currently, one part time position supports 100 teachers with copying, ordering supplies, fixing machines, etc. Also, teachers should not be spending time making copies, they should be planning, prepping, teaching and assessing.

Diana Beddows, a music teacher at Northville Elementary said the Board should restore the music position at Schaghticoke as critical, creative teachers require music. She said the STEM system (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) is becoming STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics.

Claire Willis who has three students in New Milford schools spoke in support of music at Sarah Noble. She said there is no fourth grade instrumental instruction in New Milford and students in fourth grade are excited and ready to learn.

Jeff Winter, a New Milford resident, encouraged the Board to follow the Strategic Plan which a lot of people put time and effort on. He suggested caution when thinking about moving the administrative offices for the schools but rather to look at all uses of town buildings. Finally, he asked the Board to reinvest the internal service fund which has been overfunded for a number of years. He said it could also be used to give back to the employees because they have been overpaying as well.

Margaret Fitzgerald, a New Milford resident, said the .95 positions cut from music should be reinstated next year. The Sarah Noble position at .45 cut the band out completely. She said the majority of students in the top 10 are involved in band, chorus and the arts. She also asked that the .5 position at Schaghticoke as students do not need more study halls. Music is an integral part of the curriculum.

Mrs. Faulenbach thanked the members of the public for their input.

## F. Five Year Curriculum Plan

Mrs. Thomas moved to approve the Five-Year Curriculum Plan, seconded by Mr. Nichols.

- Mr. Lawson said he felt this plan should have a technology plan as well because without a standard curriculum it is conceivable that a student could graduate with some of the competencies, all of the competencies or none of the competencies. He noted that soon students will need 25 credits to graduate and technology is a good place to start adding credits.
- Mr. Nichols thanked Dr. McLaughlin for the hard work on putting this together.
- Mrs. Thomas said the technology piece is in the process of being worked on but it is not part of the curriculum because it is a tool that students will use to accomplish what they learn. The technology plan will be looked at again and is being looked at. She said the Five Year Plan does address things that are in the Strategic Plan.
- Mr. Weinberg said there did not appear to be any rush and so perhaps this could be postponed until the technology piece could be added.
- Mrs. Tarascio-Latour also thanked Dr.
  McLaughlin and said that technology is
  running through all the classes. She said the
  Committee on Learning wanted to move
  forward with this plan.
- Mr. McSherry noted that the Board sees this plan every year and that it is updated every year. He felt technology was a tool used in education.
- Mr. Lawson said he questioned the idea of technology as a tool. He said English is a tool used to learn as well and wondered if anyone would try to cut English classes. He also said that the technology curriculum could certainly be looked at by the technology director but his job was the infrastructure and not the teaching. He said this is 2010 and kids should be prepared for the workplace.
