Dear Parent and Guardians,

This letter is to inform you that we were notified this morning of a positive COVID-19 case within our middle school. The individuals who were considered close contacts have been notified and will be required to quarantine. The Pennsylvania Department of Health has been notified and we will follow any and all recommendations that they provide.

To date, we have one positive case at the elementary school, one positive case at the middle school, and one at the high school. If the district is notified of two positive cases within a specific building during the 14-day rolling period, we will need to move to a remote instructional delivery model for that building as required by the Pennsylvania Department of Health and the Pennsylvania Department of Education for 3-7 days. This timeframe may be reduced if all contact tracing can be completed and mitigation efforts can be accomplished. At the time of this notification, all schools are still open for face to face instruction, however please have a contingency plan for your child in the event the district is required to transition to a remote instructional model.

COVID-19 is a disease that is capable of rapidly spreading person-to-person. People infected are capable of exposing others to COVID-19 even if their symptoms are mild, such as a cough, or even if they are asymptomatic. Additionally, exposure is possible by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching one's mouth, nose, or eyes. Symptoms of COVID-19 may include fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, repeated shaking, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, fatigue, congestion or runny nose, diarrhea, nausea/vomiting, and new loss of taste or smell. Older adults and people who have serious chronic medical conditions are at a higher risk for serious illness.

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19 as stated above, it is extremely important that you do not send your child to school and contact your local health care provider.

The Frazier School District is concerned about the health and well-being of you, your family and the general public during this pandemic. We understand that this is a difficult time, and that some individuals may need additional support during this period.
