Hats On for Policy Change

The Calhoun R-VIII Student Council accomplished one of their loftier goals at



Shine a Light on 5th Grade

5th Grade got even brighter in March when they made penny flashlights. Here was the involved process, from Ms. Bourland:

First they had to make a super saturated solution of water and salt. Next they added 1 tsp of vinegar to the mixture. They cut four 1/2 inch square pieces of cardboard and soaked them in the vinegar, salt and water solution. While it was soaking, they sanded the tails side of four pennies until the copper was gone and the zinc showed. Next, they laid out their cardboard pieces on a paper towel to dry a bit. Finally, they layered the pennies (in a certain order) with the moist cardboard ending with the penny





they did not sand. I gave them each a red LED bulb and they touched the long prong to the top penny and the shorter prong to the bottom. Most students' didn't light up the first time so they had to make adjustments. Some made their cardboard smaller, others added more salt and vinegar, still others simply swapped out their bulbs.
