Bulletin column 10 November 2019 "From the Pastor"

Dear parishioners,

As we approach the end of the Church year, which ends the day before the First Sunday of Advent, our readings turn to the consideration of the last things: death, judgment, heaven, and hell. We usually consider Jesus' second coming and the Last Judgment in these times, applying them to the judgment we will each face even if we die before He comes again. This Sunday's Gospel instead addresses the Sadducees' mocking of belief in the resurrection of the dead. They propose the case of a woman who, according to the dictates of the Mosaic law, marries a succession of seven brothers as they each die in their turn. (I would speculate that she had a great inheritance lawyer, but I digress.) They facetiously ask Jesus whom she will be married to in the resurrection of the dead. Jesus tells them that they do not understand the Scriptures, concluding that "He is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to Him all are alive."

Just as we as Catholics differ from our separated non-Catholic Christian brethren in our belief in purgatory, as I explored in last week's bulletin, they also differ from us in other aspects of what they believe about what happens to those who die in Christ. Many of our separated brethren of course believe in the doctrine of assurance. They would believe that anyone who has "accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior" would go directly to heaven after death regardless of whatever sins they had committed. A small number are more like us as Catholics in acknowledging that those who have accepted Christ must persevere without major sin or apostasy in order to go to heaven – a belief of course well-attested to in all of the books of the New Testament. Their main differences from us would come in the difference of how one come to be in Christ in the first place, and in their lack of acceptance of the Sacrament of Confession, which is our Catholic "life raft" if we have fallen away from Christ by serious sin.

Some of our separated brethren, while believing in the resurrection of the dead, have a different sense of how this happens than we do as Catholics. They do not believe in the innate immortality of the soul. They believe that when a Christian in Christ's grace dies, that person is truly dead. However, when Jesus comes at the end of time, that person and everyone else are raised from the dead body and soul to be judged by Christ, either to the glory of heaven or to eternal condemnation in hell.

We as Catholics have always held to the immortality of the soul. A person who dies in body is not dead in soul. He or she is immediately judged particularly by Christ, and then goes in soul to hell, to purgatory, or to heaven.

As Jesus has taught us, all are alive for God. This is why the saints in heaven can pray for us and why we can pray for the poor souls in purgatory – we are all alive in soul and united in Christ by the Holy Spirit. However, even those in heaven (aside from the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was assumed body and soul into heaven) are missing something – their true nature is to have a body as well as a soul. The saints in heaven with us await the resurrection at the end of time as we do, looking forward to the resurrection of the body, to have a glorified body as Christ does in the new and eternal Jerusalem. This is why we as Catholics require the burial of dead, even of cremated remains. Burial expresses our belief that Jesus will raise our bodies – whether they be dust or ash at the time – to life again on the Last Day. Then the judgment of all people will be made manifest for all to know. There will be no more purgatory, because all who are not condemned will live forever with God and Christ (in His gloried sacred humanity) and the saints and angels in heaven.

In any event, the message of all this is that we must always be vigilant in our lives to remain in the grace of Christ. We must strive to avoid committing mortal sins, to do all that Christian charity requires of us in terms of works of mercy, and to confess our sins whenever we fall from grace. I often encounter people in the confessional, or people who wish to fix their marriage and relationship situations, whose greatest concern is that they "feel lost" because they cannot receive Communion. While that is true and a valid concern – hunger for the Eucharist is a beautiful thing – their far greater concern ought to be that, if they are not in the grace of Christ, they are in no way ready for His judgment. We know not the day nor the hour. We as Catholics firmly believe that, if we die outside of the grace of Christ due to serious sin without having repented and confessed, we are liable to eternal damnation. This is why we pray in the act of contrition that we "fear the loss of heaven and the pains of hell." I would encourage all members of St. Michael's to examine their consciences and consider how ready they are for the judgment of Christ, and to go to confession or fix their marriage situation if needed.

This past week we received news that former St. Michael's pastor and associate pastor Fr. Oscar Perez, who remains a priest of the Archdiocese of Omaha even as he undergoes the process of incardinating into the Archdiocese of Miami, was in the ICU in Miami with a grave illness. As was reported to us priests, "He family is near, and the situation appears to be quite serious." I do not know the nature of Fr. Oscar's illness. His situation may have changed by the time of this writing. I know that Fr. Oscar was an inspiration to the faith lives and Church involvement of many of our current parishioners. It is right for us to pray fervently for him and hope in God for his recovery.

This weekend, we will be showing the video for the archbishop's annual appeal. As I have announced, many have already made their pledges to the appeal, and I thank these parishioners. Last year, we showed the video during the homily time. I am not entirely comfortable with this practice, as it disrupts the flow of the Mass. My preference would be to show the video during the announcement time. However, especially at our English-language Masses, we have a troubling phenomenon of people leaving Mass after Communion. For some, this may mean that this particular Mass was the only one that their work schedule allowed them to attend, and they have to rush off to work. That could indeed be a legitimate reason to leave early.

However, I suspect that most do so out of personal preference. Some have expressed that our Masses go too long or that we have too many announcements. Such opinions are deeply frustrating for me as a pastor. In the Mass prior to Vatican II, announcements were always given during the sermon time, as the sermon was considered an actual departure from the prayer and liturgy of the Mass (hence the making of the sign of the cross at the beginning and the end of the sermon). However, the post-conciliar rite considers the homily to be an integral part of the liturgy, not a departure from it. That's why I don't care for showing the video during the homily time. In any event, the announcements in the "Novus Ordo" Mass need to be at the end of Mass. While some fuss at the consistent repetition of certain announcements, many others have griped that we do not have enough communication in the parish. I am not comfortable failing to announce important matters and further reducing this communication. That means on some occasions that the announcements are quite long, and necessarily so.

In any event, the bottom line is that Mass does not end until the final blessing and dismissal. What is translated into "Go in peace" in the final dismissal is, in the original Latin, "Ite, missa est." This literally means, "Go forth, it is sent." The "it" in this command is, of course, the Church, the Body of Christ, in which we wish to remain for our own preparation for our particular judgment. That Latin word "missa" is actually the source of our English word "Mass" and the Spanish word "misa." If we choose to "opt out" of the final blessing because we "have better things to do" or because we think the announcements are too long or whatever else, we have missed this portion of the service which is so important that the service itself is named after it, and we have also said with our body and our time that we aren't part of that Body of Christ which is being sent forth. Moreover, our time after

receiving Communion, if we have done so, ought to be one of quiet recollection, of considering what has just happened to us in receiving the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord, especially for that 15 minutes in which He remains sacramentally present within us after receiving. Finally, leaving Mass early without a serious and pressing reason simply tells God we have better things to do than be with Him. At the Last Supper, Judas Iscariot was the only one who left early. I have every confidence that leaving Mass early after Communion for reasons other than having to rush to work or some similarly weighty concern is a major venial sin. It doesn't cut us off from God, but it hurts our life of grace quite a bit. I would urge all St. Michael's parishioners who have been engaging in this practice to consider its meaning, allow Jesus to touch their hearts, and to mend their ways in this re-

Next weekend, we will conduct our commitment weekend for the annual appeal. This will be the second of a whopping five consecutive weekends in which the second collection will be for something other than the new parish center (11/10 World Mission Sunday, 11/17 Annual Appeal, 11/24 Military Services, 12/1 the Catholic Campaign for Human Development, and 12/8 for the retired Religious). I would urge people to drop off any donations toward the parish center in the office during these weeks so that we can avoid having to take up a third collection for any of those weekends.

Finally, I am sure that many are wondering about the status of our proposed Capital Campaign. The finance committee and I have received the results of the feasibility study, and will make a final determination about whether or not to have a campaign at our meeting on November 19th. Please pray for us to make the right decisions for our parish!




