### FMMS FCCLA Students Win Awards at Region Star Event Competition

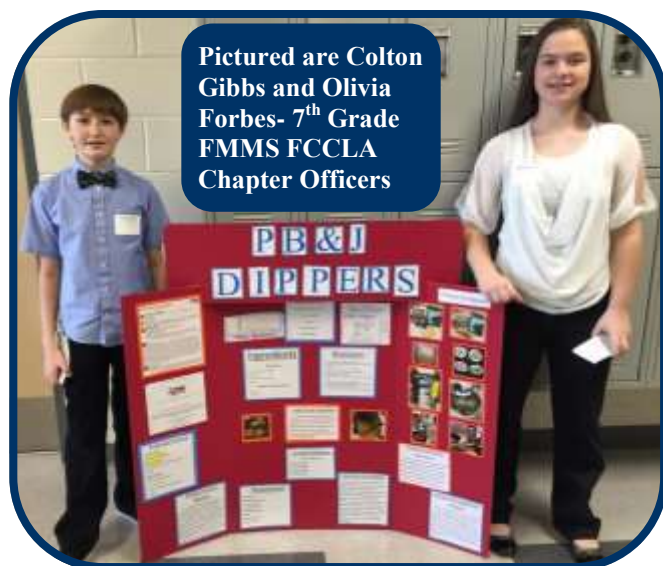

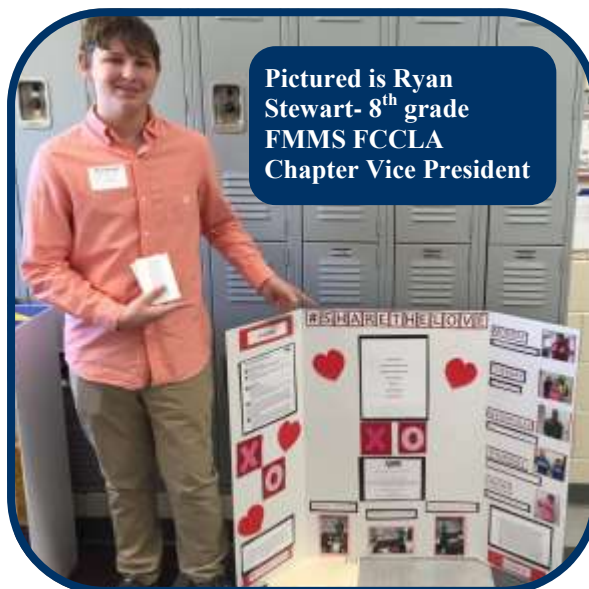
Feagin Mill Middle School FCCLA students won three Gold Medals and one Silver Medal at Region Star Event Competition and are headed to State Competition!

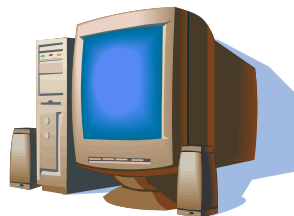

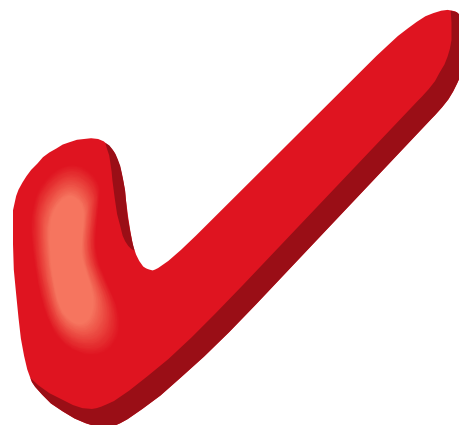

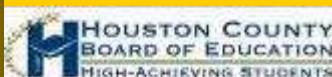
