Title I family engagement funds were used to purchase activity workbooks for all K-6 grade students. ONE STOP MONITORING SHOP!

The Georgia Statewide Longitudinal Data System (SLDS) Parent Portal is an online tool that shows your child's historical academic data. Use this site to monitor your child's performance measures, attendance, testing data, and career pathway. Also, included on the SLDS site is access to over 40,000 digital resources you can use with your child at home to support academic success. Best of all, there's no need for additional logins because SLDS is located on your parent portal. To access SLDS

- Log onto your parent portal on the school or district website
- Click "More" on the left side of page
- Click on SLDS
- If you have more than one child, use the dropdown bar beside the name section and choose the student you wish to monitor.



PARENT TIPS AIMED TO HELP KEEP STUDENTS ON THE RIGHT TRACK FOR THE THIRD NINE WEEKS
