# FREE!!

On August 31, 2020, the USDA released nationwide waivers to extend flexibilities for the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) and Seamless Summer Option (SSO) of the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) through December 31, 2020. Note: The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) reserves the right to withdraw this approval subject to the availability of funding.

## What does this mean for families in New Milford?

Effective September 14, 2020, New Milford Public Schools began offering FREE Lunch and FREE Breakfast for all students in grades PreK-12 AND to ANY New Milford resident 18 years and under, until December 31, 2020 or until otherwise noted.

# What type of lunch is included?

In order for a student to have a Free Lunch or Breakfast, the student must take a complete meal or take what is described as a "Full Lunch" or a "Full Breakfast." A "Full Lunch" includes 3 of 5 meal components including a serving of a fruit or vegetable. A "Full Breakfast" includes 3 of 4 components. A complete meal's components include: Milk (skim, 1% white, nonfat flavored), Fruit, Vegetable, Grains (whole grains), and Protein. Ala carte items, including water, snacks, and milk, are still available but not included in the Free Lunch and Breakfast program.

# For Remote Learners and Children 18 years & under not enrolled in the District:

"Curbside Meals" are available for all of our students who are Remote Learners (Cohort A & B, and Five Day Remote Learners) and for children 18 years and under not enrolled in district, also at no charge. As a reminder, preregistration for curbside meals is required by Monday of each week. Meals may be picked up once a week on Wednesdays at Sarah Noble Intermediate School between 8 AM and 9 AM. Parents or guardians can pick up meals for their students. Children do not need to be present but must be a New Milford resident. Register for Curbside Meals here: www.newmilfordps.org/curbsidemeals

# Barn Quilt Block Placed on Larson Barn at NMHS Honors Larson Family's 90 Years of Farming

The colorful ear of corn painted on an 8' x 8' simulated quilt background and hung on the big red Larson Barn at the northeastern corner of the New Milford High School property is one of 19 quilt blocks throughout New Milford. They have been placed on selected buildings around town on the New Milford Barn Quilt Trail to raise awareness of New Milford's rich agricultural past and present. Board of Education Chairperson Angela Chastain and NMPS Facilities Director Kevin Munrett were both instrumental in the design and site selection for the Larson Barn quilt block.



While barn quilt trails have been popular tourist attractions for decades in over forty US states, ours is the first and only one to date in Connecticut.

The massive English-style bank barn was built by Swedish immigrant Frank Larson in 1900, serving one of the largest dairy operations in the area. Larson also grew corn and tobacco, the most important cash crop at a time when there were over 200 family farms in New Milford alone.

The Larson family adapted to changing times in local agriculture for almost a century, ultimately surviving into the 1990s on the strength of their famous sweet corn, sold at a farm stand where today, the high school stands. Artifacts found when the high school was being built suggest that Native Americans occupied this area up to 8,000 years ago.

In her 1931 novel *American Beauty*, the great US novelist Edna Ferber described the area in which the Larson Farm was located as "the rich green valleys of that spectacular part of Connecticut...brilliant emerald in the summer sunshine, the tobacco farms...a rich and heartening sight." In 2006, the Larson barn was listed on the Connecticut State Register of Historic Places.



In 2017, the first phase of the New Milford Barn Quilt Trail, consisting of eight barn quilt blocks, was completed with partial funding from the Connecticut Office of Tourism of the Connecticut Department of Economic and Community Development. New Milford is a Bronze-certified sustainable town and the 2020 expansion of an additional 11 quilt blocks was funded by generous donations from area residents matched dollar for dollar by Sustainable CT via <a href="www.ioby.org">www.ioby.org</a>, a non-profit crowd-funding website.

To help make the project a reality, New Milford-based KatArt donated design work, and the New Milford Sherwin Williams store supplied paints at cost for the Village Center for the Arts team, which was commissioned by the six-member volunteer Barn Quilt Trail Committee to paint most of the quilt blocks.





The New Milford Commission on the Arts provided a significant grant to assist in completing the project. The Facilities Department of New Milford Public Works assembled most of the 2020 all-weather polyurethane quilt blocks (including by flashlight during the August Isaias storm outage!) so New Milford would be ready for late August filming by Connecticut Public Television (CPTV). This will be a special showcasing this fall of five exciting projects by Sustainable CT-certified municipalities. A guided tour of the entire 19-site New Milford Barn Quilt Trail will be organized for the public following updating of the webpage at <a href="https://www.newmilfordfarmlandpres.org/barn-quilt-trail">www.newmilfordfarmlandpres.org/barn-quilt-trail</a>.
