#### **CLASS DESCRIPTION**

This reading/language arts class is designed to increase communication skills through reading, writing, speaking, and the study of the English language. Our primary focus will be the mastery of the different writing styles, demonstration of the rules of grammar, and the ability to express yourself orally.

This year we will read a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts including novels, short stories, dramas, poetry, and essays. These writing pieces will model the different writing styles we will be working on ourselves. Writing assignments may include timed responses, journal writing, essays, critiques, and creative pieces. Vocabulary and grammar assignments will also be an important part of this class. Because we are a community of learners, please also expect to work periodically in group situations and to present information to your peers in groups or individually.

Please understand that at-home reading is expected and is a component of our course. Students will be held accountable for at-home reading by various methods. The best way to improve reading skills and vocabulary is to read more and more. Reading ability affects all aspects of life.

#### **REDO/RETAKE POLICY**

•Only one redo per assignment will be allowed,

- excluding homework.
- •The higher of the two grades will be recorded.
- •Student will be required to fill out a Redo Request with parental signature.
- •The Redo Request must be submitted within one week of receiving the graded work.
- •The teacher will assign remedial work and establish a due date.
- The student must show understanding of the skills assessed.
- •The teacher may choose to assign more remediation.
- •The teacher and student will then schedule a date and
- time for the redo/retake outside of regularly scheduled class time

### YEAR-LONG SKILLS

•This list consists of skills that will be continuously reinforced, practiced, and assessed. These skills are fundamental to most portions of reading and writing, and it is essential that students build on these basic skills.

•Year-Long Reading and Writing Skills: parts of speech, subject-verb agreement, types of sentences, clauses/phrases, other grammar skills, central idea, key details, text analysis, and citing textual evidence.

Throughout all of our writing we will also utilize the multi-step writing process to develop, revise, evaluate, and improve our writing.

In all units, we will address the various element of specific genres (including but not limited to organization, purpose, audience, narration, conflict, sound, graphics, tone, and theme).

\*Teachers will add or delete resources as needed.
