#### **Old Business:**

Healthy Choices (Nutrition) for Athletes

WHS is going to pilot the program. New points of contact to get it off the ground are Mandy Tuggle, (Asst. Principal), Leslie Jessup (School Counselor) and Phillip Yarbrough (PE and Health)

#### Youth Mental Health First Aid

Erin Starr (Coordinator of Administrative Services for Students) and Kendall Phillips (Randolph County Public Health) are continuing to train RCSS staff. Title IV funding is assisting with Youth Mental Health First Aid training. During 2019-2020, the following groups will receive this training: Principals, Assistant Principals, Lead Teachers, Career Development Coordinators, Media Specialist, all staff at the Randolph Early College High School and 3 classroom teachers from each RCSS school.

Upcoming trainings: January 26, 2020-AT area schools (classroom teachers) February 17 (classroom teachers)

#### **New Business:**

- 1. Title V funding (Sexual Risk Avoidance Educational Grant):
  - This funding has not officially been allotted at this time. RCSS has been notified that funding will be awarded again to the district.
  - Edwina Ashworth shared on behalf of Dr. Chappell that currently the proposal for the use of funding would be:
    - o Continue partnership with the Poe Center for 5th grade puberty lessons
    - Continue to provide technology (Chromebooks) to 6th grade health teachers to enhance the digital learning opportunities in the health curriculum and purchasing an additional Tech Tubs (which can charge 6 Chromebooks at a time)
    - Provide additional professional development to 6th grade health teachers to support effective lesson planning
    - Continue to provide additional professional development, such as 2-day Reconnect to Resilience Training (School Counselors, SSW's and School Nurses were trained last year)

  - Brenda Goss could offer free trainings to employees on "Paper Tigers" and "Resilience"
  - Megan Tarver could offer the "Darkness to Light Training"
  - Medicaid transformation is on hold currently
  - Megan Tarver replaced Lucy Dorsey at Sandhills Center Mental Health
