

...and Baby Emerald (Emory) was born to Sapphire two days later on January 22nd.









No Drip Jell-O Popsicles

Instructions


- 1. Pour your pops straight into a Dixie cup.

 *Note: Use a baking tray or large plate to keep all of your cups from falling in the freezer.




GEOGRAPHY

Mrs. Lamey's Awesome 6th Graders

Students completed a Timeline Research Project on the Evolution of various "things" to go along with their Science Unit and the Evolution of animals! As groups they created presentations on the classroom smartboard using examples of how things change over time such as television sets to cars.





The class presented vocabulary words to each other through an activity using visuals to help each other understand the vocab words. These girls are explaining what an organ system is using a diagram they drew.





SVRCS would like to congratulate their 148 students in grades 5-12 that met honor roll or high honor roll for the second marking period of the school year. This calculates to 47% of the school population from grades 5-12!!

In order to meet honor roll expectations, the students must maintain an average overall grade of 90% - 94.999% in all subjects. High honor roll expectations are met with an average of 95% to 100% overall for classes.





There was also a celebration at the end of the second nine weeks honoring students from kindergarten through 6th grade that achieved perfect attendance. Students gather together to congratulate their schoolmates on that accomplishment. At completion of the second marking period, a total of 125 students achieved perfect attendance. That is 25% of our student population!!

The staff loves seeing our kids here every day and we also appreciate all of the precautions our families take to ensure the health and safety of our staff and students.
