Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity was founded at Howard University in Washington, D.C., January 9, 1914, by three young African-American male students. The Founders, Honorable A. Langston Taylor, Honorable Leonard F. Morse, and Honorable Charles I. Brown, wanted to organize a Greek letter fraternity that would truly exemplify the ideals of brotherhood, scholarship, and service.

The Founders deeply wished to create an organization that viewed itself as "a part of" the general community rather than "apart from" the general community. From its inception, the Founders also conceived Phi Beta Sigma as a mechanism to deliver services to the general community.

Today, Phi Beta Sigma has blossomed into an international organization of leaders. No longer a single entity, members of the Fraternity have been instrumental in the establishment of the Phi Beta Sigma National Foundation, the Phi Beta Sigma Federal Credit Union and The Sigma Beta Club Foundation. Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, founded in 1920 with the assistance of Phi Beta Sigma, is the sister organization of the Fraternity

Sigma Sapphire Scholarship Application

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Applicant Requirements:

- Any male high school senior planning to attend a four (4) year college or university.
 (Letters of intent must verify student will be attending institution).
- Senior Student at local area High School
- Must be a student seeking to pursue and succeed in any educational field.
- Must have received an acceptance letter from an accredited college or university
- Must submit an official transcript (Traditional or Electronic) with the school seal and an authorized official's signature
- * Must submit a professional resume'
- Must complete the essay section of the application
- Must submit a completely executed and signed Sigma Sapphire Scholarship application (original or electronic signature acceptable)
- Must include a 4x6 original photograph or electronic photograph, 300 dpi (Color or Black and White) in dress attire.

Rules and Regulations:

- 1. All entries into this application form and its attachments must be true and accurate.
- 2. All copies of transcripts must be the official.
- 3. Once scholarship has been awarded and any instance of criminal activities is detected or reported will disqualify applicant from the scholarship and any future, additional, or continuing awards sponsored by the Tau Sigma Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.
- 4. Applicant must provide proof of participation in a community service project.
- 5. Applicant must display proper etiquette while dancing with escort at the ceremony.
- 6. Applicant must be able to speak publicly.
- 7. All awardees must conduct themselves on/off the campus in which they enroll in a way which garners the respect of other students on/off the campus, and all officials of the university. Any changes in awardees' enrollment status or contact information must be reported to the Tau Sigma Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. as soon as possible.

IF MORE APPLICATIONS ARE RECEIVED THAN CAN BE FUNDED WITH THE MONIES AVAILABLE, THE APPLICATIONS WITH THE HIGHEST GRADE POINT AVERAGES, AND WHICH MEETS ALL OF THE OTHER CRITERIA WILL BE GIVEN FIRST PREFERENCE FOR THE AWARD.
