

Making "Dirt Pudding"

After that, find the Oreo® cookies and put two cookies in the baggie.



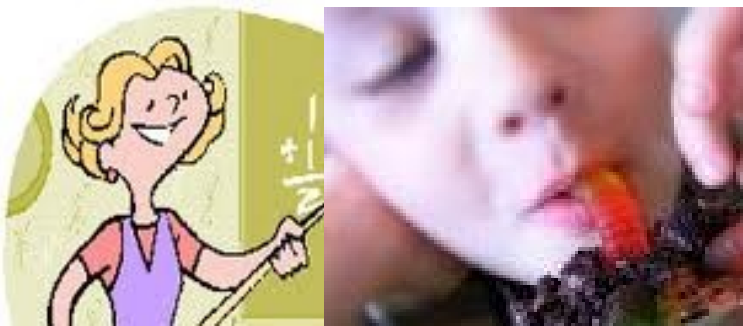
Then, close the baggie and crush the Oreos® with your hand.

This activity is intended to be done in stations. The objectives of the activity include reading with independence (or minimal assistance), independently following directions, practice with transitional vocabulary, oral recall of completed steps and understanding new vocabulary.

It was originally developed for a classroom which had students who have a variety of disabilities including multiple disabilities, but could very easily be used in the general education classroom.

To set up the activity, gather all of your supplies and ingredients and arrange them in stations according to the directions.
