Taylor County, Fla.— Securing and distributing COVID-19 vaccine is a top priority for the state of Florida. In compliance with Governor DeSantis's Executive Order 20-315, the Florida Department of Health in Taylor County has expanded vaccination efforts to include the following populations:

- Long-term care facility residents and staff;
- Persons 65 years of age and older;
- Health care personnel with direct patient contact;
- K-12 school employees 50 years of age and older;
- Sworn law enforcement officers 50 years of age and older;
- Firefighters 50 years of age and older;
- Persons determined by a physician to be extremely vulnerable to COVID-19. Physicians
 can fax documentation to 850-584-7335 or documentation can be provided in-person at
 the time of vaccination. Documentation must include full name, date of birth and phone
 number until a form prescribed by the Florida Department of Health is available. If
 documentation is faxed, DOH-Taylor will contact you to set the appointment.

Those that meet the above criteria can call 850-584-5087 to schedule their appointment. If your physician is providing documentation directly to DOH-Taylor, you will be contacted as soon as it is received.
