The school will continue to issue hardcopy Learning Support Kits for families.

Call in or communicate your daily attendance before 10:00 AM. Please review progress reports and stay on top of "missing assignments." This is to keep you informed as to how your child is doing in each content area, please work with your classroom teacher to address missing or late assignments. Parents please be aware that your student needs an e-mail account in order to allow access the school web-page.
