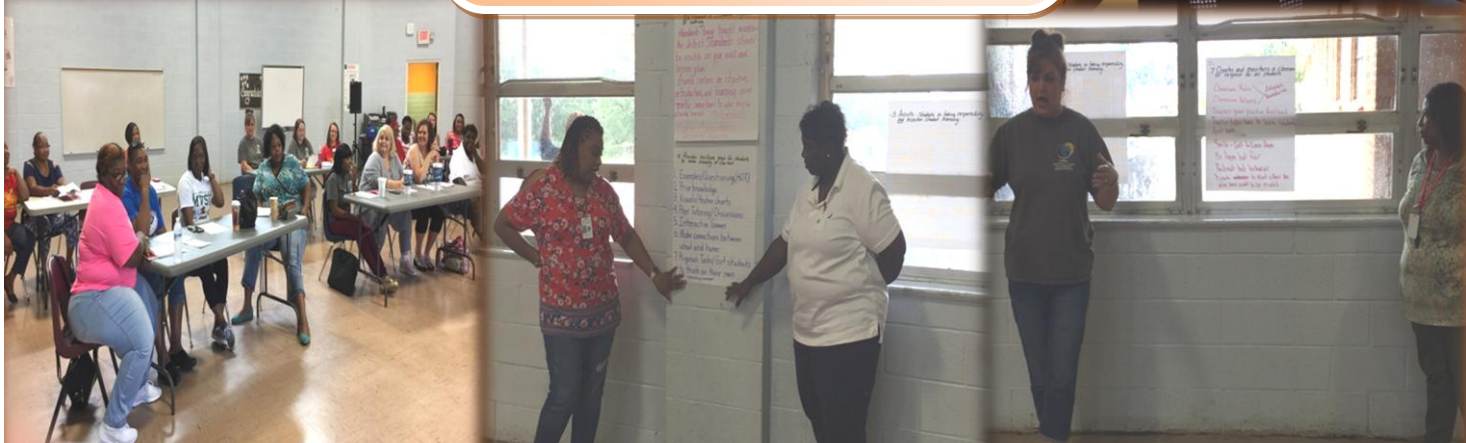

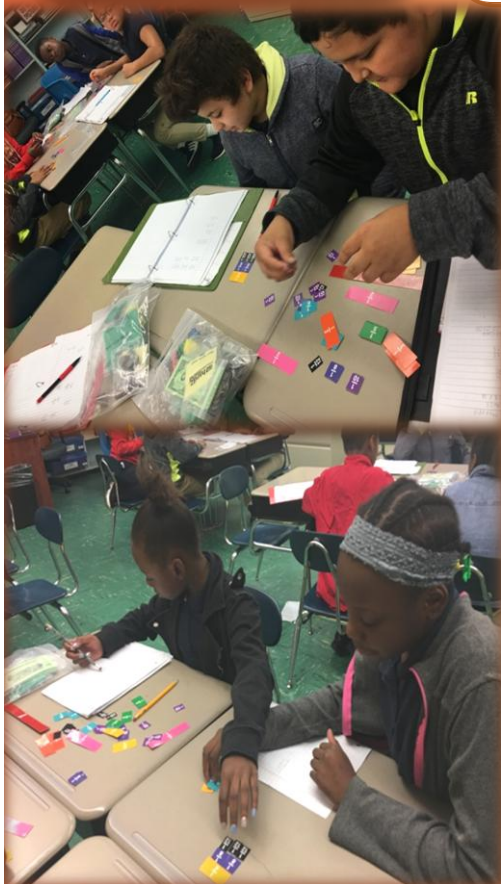


A.W. JAMES ELEMENTARY WELCOMES *The Kellogg Foundation*

A.W. James' students had the opportunity to show what they learned during Fire Safety Week. They practiced the steps to take in the event of an actual fire. Great job students!



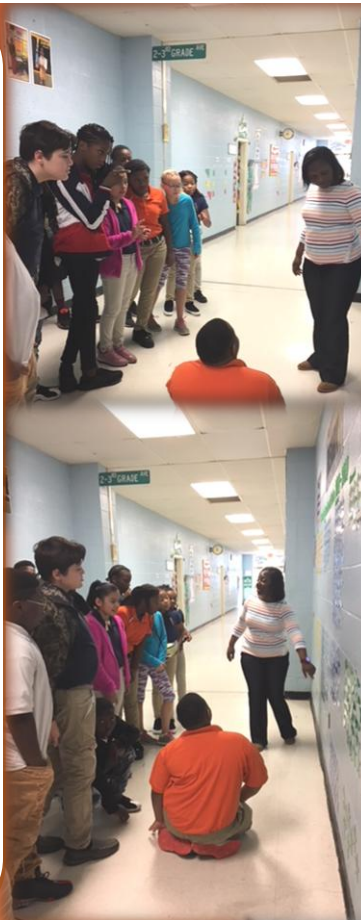

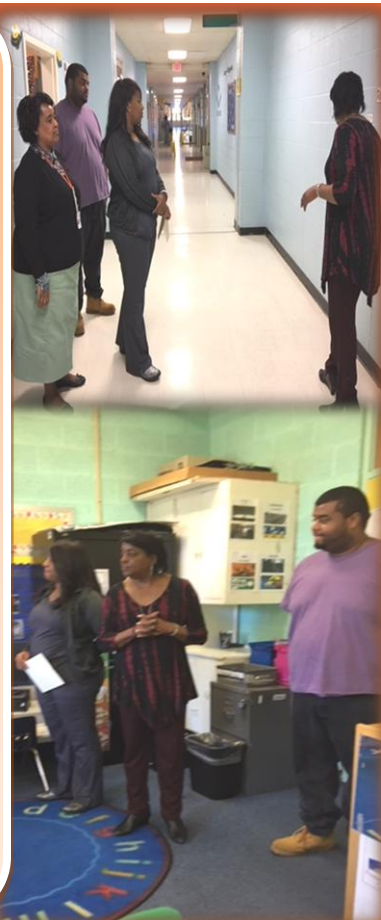
Word of the month
