HOUSTON COUNTY, GA – Houston County high schools have announced their valedictorian and salutatorian for the Classes of 2021. The top graduates are:

Houston County High Valedictorian, Rumi Lee



Rumi Lee's honors include National U.S. Chemistry Olympiad Finalist, Flint Energies Washington Youth Tour Delegate, Massachusetts Institute of Technology LaunchX Finalist and Georgia Governor's Honors Program Finalist. She has served on the State Superintendent's Student Advisory Board and represented Georgia Region 8 for the U.S. Senate Youth Program. Lee founded her school's Studio 605 and Girls Who Code chapter, and was recognized as a National Congressional App Challenge Winner. She is the Class of 2021 Vice President and Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) chapter president. Her awards include FBLA National Publication Design contest. She also volunteered at the FireStarter FABLab, teaching introductory digital design classes to community members. A classically trained violinist, she has been recognized at the Music Teachers National

Association and Georgia Music Educators Association. Lee is interested in pursuing computer science and is a finalist for the Georgia Institute of Technology Stamps President's Scholars Program. Houston County High Salutatorian, Emma Ringe

Emma Ringe is her school's Student Council President and has served as State President and Crowd Compass App Consultant. She is also Brass Captain of the Black and Silver Brigade, Math Team captain, and a member of the National Honors Society and Beta Club. Ringe has won several state and national Beta Club awards in creative writing and math. At the Georgia Social Studies Fair, she won Best in Class III, Best in Division History and Best STEM Project. Accolades include National Merit Finalist, Governor's Honors Program and acceptance into the Georgia Institute of Technology's distance mathematics program. An AP Scholar with Distinction, she earned a score of five on six Advanced Placement (AP) exams. In addition, Ringe was named the District STAR Student for the county. She enjoys volunteering with local elementary schools, school clean-ups,

Northside High Valedictorian, Clara Perkins

Perry High Valedictorian, Maximus Genio



Maximus Genio is an AP Scholar with Distinction, who took rigorous courses to include AP Statistics, AP World History, AP American History, AP Biology, AP Language & Composition, AP Computer Science, AP Calculus AB, AP Literature & Composition and AP Macroeconomics. He earned the highest average in Honors Biology, Honors Chemistry, Honors Geometry, Honors Literature, Honors U.S. & World Affairs and AP World History. Genio received a Georgia Certificate of Merit from the University of Georgia and was selected for the 2020 Georgia State University Summer Leadership Academy. He has served as president of both the National Honor Society and Interact Club. Genio participated in international community service in Southern Leyte, Philippines. A member of the Perry High band, he has participated in elite wind ensemble, marching band, indoor

percussion, steel drum band and percussion ensemble. He was the 2019 snare drum section leader and 2020 percussion captain. Genio was selected for the GMEA District 8 and South Georgia Region Honor Bands from 2018-2020 and the 2019 GMEA 9-10 All-State Band. He was the drummer for the 2021 AAAA state championship one-act play and member of the Esports team. He plans to attend Georgia Institute of Technology to pursue an industrial engineering degree and a minor in computer science. Genio is the son of Lt. Col.
