She used to listen to and read stories about World War I pilots. She tried to apply for flying schools in America but because she was black they refused her entry. She then moved to France where she finally managed to obtain her pilot's license. During her time in France, she even managed to teach herself, French.

Bessie specialized in stunt flying and parachuting. She earned a living by performing aerial shows. Unfortunately, she died on April 30th, 1926 at the age of 34 while rehearsing for an aerial show. She was well known for being a pioneer of women in the field of aviation.
