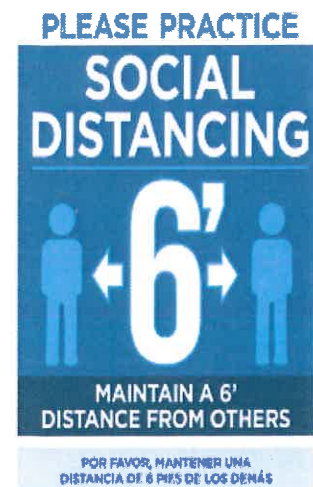
COMMUNICATION



Prattville Intermediate School will continue to utilize the following modes of communication to deliver important safety instructions and information to our students, faculty, staff, and parents.

-  Direct Verbal/Non-verbal Instruction

-  School Messenger (voice callout, email, texts)
-  Monthly School Newsletter
-  Handouts (how to identify symptoms and stop the spread of COVID-19, etc.)

In addition, signage has been placed throughout our campus relative to the required procedures including masks/shields, handwashing, social distancing, etc.



PREVENTION PROTOCOL



Prattville Intermediate School will implement the following preventive measures:

- 🐾 order and frequently use mass quantities of sanitizing supplies equipment and supplies
- 🐾 equip all restrooms with soap dispensers and hand dryers
- 🐾 teach and reinforce good hygiene measures
- 🐾 clean/disinfect frequently used surfaces
- 🐾 provide masks, face shields, and other appropriate PPE to staff
- 🐾 eliminate the sharing of objects and/or supplies
- 🐾 eliminate use of water fountains (excluding emergencies)
- 🐾 students may bring a filled water bottle from home
- 🐾 install glass dividers in main office area



STUDENTS' SCREENING

- 🐾 Home will be the initial point of COVID-19 detection. Thus, parents will be provided with information relative to recognizing symptoms, spread prevention, good hygiene, etc.
- 🐾 The administration and/or other school personnel will frequently communicate with bus drivers to make certain students are not entering our building with COVID symptoms.
- 🐾 Faculty/Staff will be trained on visual screening of students.

STUDENTS' ENTRY AND EXIT PROCEDURES



The following students' entry/exit procedures have been implemented to ensure adequate supervision and proper social distancing.

- 🐾 7:15 a.m. bus arrivals will report to the designated areas in the lunchroom (5th graders section A 6th graders section B).
- 🐾 Car riders will enter the building at 7:15 a.m. and report to the lunchroom through the external doors near the music room.
- 🐾 Students arriving by bus after 7:30 a.m. will report directly to their assigned homeroom.



- 🐾 Car riders will be called by their hallway color and individual student number beginning at 2:40 p.m.
- 🐾 Bus riders will be called for dismissal by bus number beginning at 3:00 p.m.
- 🐾 5th grade bus riders will exit the building via the breezeway doors located between the 5th and 6th grade hallway.
- 🐾 6th grade bus riders will exit the building via the bus loop external doors (Mrs. Cook).



BREAKFAST PROCEDURES

Breakfast will be served daily beginning at 7:30 a.m.

- 🐾 Students will eat breakfast in their classroom.
- 🐾 Teachers will send their meal cart by a student and their breakfast/lunch folder, which includes meal count, and selected menu items,) to the lunchroom.
- 🐾 Meal carts will be filled by the lunchroom staff.
- 🐾 Receiving student will be required to socially distance him/herself in the lunchroom during breakfast pickup.
- 🐾 The custodial staff will immediately discard trash items.

LUNCH PROCEDURES

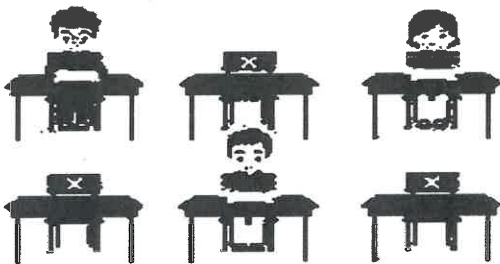
- 🐾 Lunch will served in our classrooms.
- 🐾 Teachers will send their meal cart by a student, their breakfast/lunch folder, which includes meal count, and selected menu items to the lunchroom.
- 🐾 Meal carts will be filled by lunchroom staff.
- 🐾 Social distancing requirements will be implemented during lunch pickup.
- 🐾 Students will not be allowed to share food items.
- 🐾 Students assigned for breakfast/lunch pickup must wear a mask for the duration of pickup.
- 🐾 Hot menu items will be available periodically for lunch and breakfast.



TRANSITION PROCEDURES

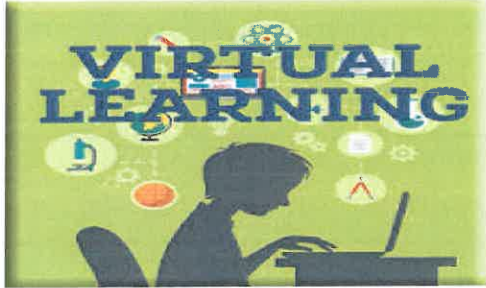
To minimize possible person-to-person contact, students will only transition to physical education. Students will remain with their homeroom teacher all day.

- 🐾 Floor markings will indicate social distancing requirements.
- 🐾 Students' locker use is eliminated.
- 🐾 Restrooms breaks will be scheduled to ensure that only one class is present in the hallway.
- 🐾 Computer/IPad lab classes are cancelled until further notice.
- 🐾 Additional transition procedures will be included as it becomes necessary to do so.



TRADITIONAL STUDENT LEARNING

- 🐾 All classes will have assigned student seating.
- 🐾 Teacher and students are required to wear masks or facial shields in the classroom setting.
- 🐾 Supplies/equipment sharing is strictly prohibited.
- 🐾 Group projects/cooperative learning tasks are not allowed.



- 🐾 Students opting for virtual learning must have a learning Coach.
- 🐾 Students must have internet access and a device.
- 🐾 Device hardships can be appealed to the principal for consideration.
- 🐾 *Schoology* is the virtual learning platform.
- 🐾 PIS has for virtual teachers assigned to teach virtual students.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION






- 🐾 To ensure proper social distancing, all PE classes will be held outside weather permitting.
- 🐾 If high temperatures, rain, or any other weather hazard prevent outside PE, classes will be held in three alternate locations (gym, library, and lunchroom).
- 🐾 Activities/games that require person-to-person contact are not allowed.






VULNERABLE POPULATIONS (Special Education & 504)

Prattville Intermediate School will continue to work in earnest to meet the needs of our vulnerable populations. In doing so, we will adhere to the following:

-  Hold timely meetings in the safest and most effective manner possible (i.e., face to face, teleconference, Zoom, etc.).
-  Strictly adhere to each IEP or 504 as outlined.
-  Gifted students will continue to receive services in both virtual and traditional settings.



-  Out of an abundance of caution, visitors will not be allowed on campus (w/minimum exception).
-  Check-outs/ins can occur as normal with appropriate social distancing.
-  Parent volunteers are also restricted.
