- I. Welcome and call to order Carol Anderson. Carol welcomed all to the meeting and shared copies of minutes from the secretary and treasurer of the previous Annual Report. Minutes and financials were available for comparison. A motion to approve the minutes was made and seconded by Melanie and Ed. Motion was carried.
- II. WAO Education Foundation Financial Review with Fransden Bank: Justin Brooks requested to be first on the agenda due to the poor weather conditions tonight. He provided the Foundation with information regarding holdings, assets, stocks/bonds and dividends. We received multiple handouts which will be attached to these minutes for complete review. He shared that our 4th quarter was rough, but we've made a comeback during our first quarter this year. Current + \$652,598.00.
 - Justin further informed the Foundation that Fransden Bank is interested in again sponsoring a hole and will golf during our annual tournament to be held during the All School Reunion weekend.
- III. 2018 Scholarship Recipients: A recap of the scholarship meeting reminded the Foundation that there was a total of \$42,800 awarded to 21 seniors last year. Total purchases for classrooms and supplies were also reviewed with \$39,967.05 being donated by the WAO Education Foundation.
- IV. New Scholarships: Two new scholarships were put in place this year. Dennis and Louise Brekke and Kenneth Poolman.

A motion by Ed / Dewey was made to adjourn the annual meeting.



CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

2019 was another exciting year for the Warren/Alvarado/Oslo Public School Education Foundation. There has been a two-way street with us reaching out to alumni and also with alumni reaching out to us. Our scholarships and memberships continued to grow. We are constantly overwhelmed with the generosity of our communities, alumni and friends for their involvement and carrying out the motto and mission statement of the Foundation.

The third weekend in July was a huge milestone for our communities, school, and area with the Marshall County Fair, our 15th Annual Golf Scramble, and the Alvarado/Oslo/Valley North, and Warren All-School Reunion. The town was filled with visitors from across America and some foreign countries. The halls of WAO were filled with more chatter than on a regular school day! Hugs, tears, laughter, and smiles radiated throughout the buildings as classmates and friends recalled the good times along with memories of events and folks that are no longer with us or were unable to attend. Over 600 people attended the Saturday afternoon program in the auditorium. Along with the All-School Reunion many individual classes gathered together. Many of the Alvarado Alumni gathered at the Alvarado Community Center for a time of renewal and memory sharing.

183 golfers participated in our largest scramble in the 15 years of existence. Even with the large turnout of golfers, the event moved very smoothly. We cleared over \$26,700. We are most grateful and indebted to our wonderful donors, sponsors, golfers, volunteers, and to everyone who helped us in any way.

The WAO Class of 2019 had 61 scholarships totaling \$69,800 presented to them. Most of these scholarships are facilitated by the Foundation, but in addition we presented seven of our own. The above amount includes the Greg. M. Haugen Memorial Scholarships and the Robert L. Strandberg Memorial Scholarships that are renewable for a total of four years of college.

Our WAO seniors have many opportunities for scholarships through the Foundation thanks to the generosity and support of many families and alumni. During 2019 these scholarships were added: WHS Class of 1967 Scholarship, Louie & Gertie Kuznia Memorial Scholarship, the Curt & Faye Kuznia and Family Endowment Scholarship, the Judovsky Family Scholarship, the WHS Class of 1960 Scholarship, and the WHS Class of 1969 Scholarship. Wow!

During 2019, 66 condolence letters were mailed along with one of our brochures to families of deceased alumni and friends. We also continue to send a letter to these people when a memorial has been given to the Foundation. No amounts are listed, but we list the names that have donated and if the total is over \$100 we include information stating that their name will be placed on the monitor on our donor wall in memory of that person.

Each February and September the WAO staff have the opportunity to submit needs request forms to the Foundation. This is for items over and beyond what the district provides for their classrooms. During 2019 we funded \$45,740.

We had two Baked Potato/Salad Bar events this year because the Stephen/Argyle boys basketball game for 2018-2019 was in January and the game for 2019-2020 was in December. Again, these events wouldn't be possible without our wonderful volunteers. The WAO Staff and Employees donated food as well as their time helping with the events. The proceeds of these events go back into their classroom and activities through their needs requests.

We continue to present new licensed, certified staff with a \$200 welcome gift to purchase items for their classroom/project area. In addition, each is presented with a \$50 gift certificate from the WAO Wearhouse to purchase Pony attire.

During American Education Week in November we hosted a luncheon for all school personnel as a thank you for all of the things that they do for our students and school. Again, some of our wonderful volunteers assisted with this project.

The cookbook project that one of our school board liaisons, Sally Roller, originated has been very successful. This project brought in \$2,850 during this year. We still have a few boxes of cookbooks and would be happy to mail one out for a fee of \$20 or for you to pick one up at many of the Warren businesses for \$15.00. It is filled with mouthwatering recipes from many alumni, staff, and friends from near and far!

We continue to work hard at keeping our database as up-todate as possible. We appreciate all of the notices that we receive about name and address changes along with other information.

Long time board member Ellen (Fillipi) Strickler resigned from the board at the end of 2019. Thank you, Ellen, for ALL of the work that you did with special projects/events and the Connections in addition to regular board duties. We appreciate you very much and look forward to having you volunteer with us in the future.

We appreciate the work of many people to keep everything running smoothly. Heidi Thorstenson, WAO Tech Coordinator, keeps our pages on the school website up to date under the link to the WAO Education Foundation. Feel free to check out the page entitled *Recently Deceased Family and Friends* for recent death information. We can only include the information that we have, so we're asking you to keep us updated on any obituaries or deaths of classmates/alumni. Our office manager, Carol Bowman, does all of the computer work, receipts, and keeps our database up to date. She along with Katie (Lind) Holte of Phil Thompson & Associates keep all of our bookkeeping accurate. Tamara (Johnson) Oberg keeps our Facebook page intact.

Please remember that if you give a gift to the Foundation that you may attach a note or write in the memo of your check that you would like it designated to a specific scholarship, grade, or department. All undesignated donations/memorials go into the general fund.

We continue to grow, people know about us, and we are moving forward. We appreciate the WAO communities, all of our alumni and friends along with the district Lon Jorgensen, Ben Miska, and Kirk Thorstenson.

All of the things that we've worked on, accomplished, and succeeded with are because of the DEDICATED, DEVOTED WAO Education Foundation board members who give freely of their time and talents.
