

Parent Involvement

Title I schools must comply with the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015. Parents should be involved in "an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the parental involvement policy in improving the academic quality of the schools".

Parent's Right to Know

In accordance with the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, Parent's Right To Know, every parent of a student in a Title I school has the right to request and receive information in a timely manner regarding the professional qualifications of your student's classroom teachers. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information:

Whether the Arizona Department of Education has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.

Whether the Arizona Department of Education has decided that the teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.

The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.

Whether the student is provided services by paraprofessionals, and if so, their qualifications.
