Rhonda (Jones) Heyd: Country Roots To Country Boots

According to Rhonda, (Oslo High School, Class of 1987) those words ring ever true to her heart. Her country roots began strong and her country boots are kickin' up memories every day! Rhonda's story begins with her modest, rural American roots. Her education began as an Alvarado Indian way back in the late 70's. She was always proud and happy to be a small-town, country girl! She and her only brother, Rodney moved to Alvarado in 1977. They had the good fortune to live just two houses down from their cousins, Will Bayne and Mike and Spencer Selnes. She fondly recalls the blessings that come with having cousins in her life was endless and those memories are valuable treasures for her to this day. All of them went to school together, along with other Alvarado cousins Troy, Tadd and Travis Vanyo. Rhonda fondly reflects, "this small town living was an amazing experience!" Coincidentally, all their parents were also graduates of Alvarado, as well! There were a lot of Vanyo family members (aunts, uncles and cousins) in those graduating high school class pictures that lined the hallways. She shares how well she remembers how several kids would congregate at "The Court" in the summer and taking the bus to Warren for swimming lessons, T-ball and bible camp. In the winter months, several kids would go ice skating. Rhonda can still remember the smell of the warming house when their wet mittens would rest on the heater and that smell of burnt yarn would start lingering. It was a quick reminder that you'd better get your mittens off that heater before a hole burnt through them! In her rural community, she commented that they always felt safe and would go trick-or-treating all over the town ~ then the cousins would get together and trade different candies with each other and have fun building card houses. Family time was valued and a rich part of her

upbringing, so, for her family, it was a huge deal when the first video game "Pong" was rolled out and even a bigger family event when cable TV came to Alvarado. Their extended family played together countless hours. As she reflected on childhood memories, she noted how they played a significant role in developing a passion for music, songs and singing and served as a backdrop to her lyrics.

Rhonda recalled her high school years being filled with volleyball and cheering for the local basketball teams. She spoke of enjoying music and academics and fondly recalled taking piano lessons from Mona (Heggasteun) Schroeder, Spanish, FHA and attending school dances. She reflected once that she and Lewis Rogalla won first place in a dance contest, winning a 6-pack of Dr. Pepper! Rhonda enjoyed being a varsity basketball cheerleader during her freshman year for the Alvarado Indians. The following year, her family relocated and she and her brother suddenly became students in the Oslo School District. Rhonda continued to cheer ~ cheering against her rival community of Alvarado! While in Oslo, choir, art and cheering were again favorite activities for Rhonda, she especially felt honored to cheer for her brother's team. One preferred class in high school was Spanish; it gave her the opportunity to be bused back to Alvarado, and her friends, daily to attend class. Rhonda recalls loving that class and has found it useful in college and throughout her adult life as well. She shared a few other fond Oslo High School memories: she especially enjoyed Joe Corradi's "row quizzes" ~ everyone who was a student of Mr. Corradi loved him and thought he was an awesome teacher. Mr. Dave Schroeder was another favorite teacher Rhonda remembers well. She and her classmates felt it was always exciting finding out who was sitting at "The Brown Table" during lunch break. She also recalled the annual Bean Days Parade and activities always being thrilling to all in the community.

While in high school, Rhonda learned to play guitar and would sing with her dad's band, "Thunder Ridge." She didn't realize it then, but her robust love for the stage and music was beginning, playing and singing onstage for the first time at age 14 and from then on, she found herself "hooked on country and gospel music." Her love and passion had begun! Without realizing it, she found that writing music was an undeveloped gift and by the time graduation came around, Rhonda was writing her own music. As a senior in high school, she was given the opportunity to let her talent shine when she was selected to

perform the very first song she ever wrote during her graduation ceremony. Following the ceremony, she spent the rest of the evening performing with Thunder Ridge at her own graduation party. Those two memories are two of her most cherished memories to date.

Following graduation, Rhonda's folks divorced, with her father remarrying and adopting her beautiful step-sister, Courtney (Argyle, MN). Though Courtney didn't grow up with them, they loved her as a sister and Rhonda enjoyed coming home to watch her school concerts and plays. Rhonda began her post-secondary career at Northland Community and Technical College in Thief River Falls and earned an Associate of Arts degree. Then shortly thereafter obtained her Licensed Practical Nursing (LPN) degree. She accepted a position in East Grand Forks at the Good Samaritan Center. It was during this time that she met and married her first husband. He worked for Vigen Construction; she found it exciting when his company sent him to Wisconsin and California to work on renovations to the Anheuser-Busch Company facilities. Making this move allowed Rhonda to experience life outside of Minnesota. For the first time ever, she experienced NO SNOW in the winter! Rhonda made her first TV appearance in 1988 where she sang and performed two of her original songs for a Christmas promotional telethon. In 2001, the couple moved back to Grand Forks but decided to part ways. That was when she accepted a position at Noridian Healthcare Services but continued pursuing her passion in music by volunteering in several music and singing groups.

Rhonda's "Country Boots" were starting to kick up some new dust! In February of 2013, while co-hosting a volunteer community guitar group, she met her second husband and musical partner, DuWayne Heyd. He'd come to listen to her group that day. A friend of hers asked her to have DuWayne join the group onstage. Following the performance, he joined her music circle and later walked her to her car that afternoon. The rest is, as they say, history. Rhonda and DuWayne began an immediate courtship and were married one year later to the day in Las Vegas. Because he'd been a veteran to many local "gigs" and had a lifelong dream of playing at the Opry, DuWayne wanted to share that with Rhonda. He exposed her to much more traveling and fun adventures! DuWayne had an established music career in the 90's, including a traveling Opry-style show. She states that DuWayne wanted to "offer me that

The couple never lived in Nashville, but they would spend 3 weeks there, recording and performing at various venues. While in Nashville, Rhonda had the opportunity to perform with Johnny Cash’s youngest sister, Joanne Cash. Her husband served as the pastor at her church in Nashville and she performed with her band there. Rhonda commented that she also had the fortunate opportunity to meet Glen Campbell’s younger brother ~ a fiddle player ~ and they performed together with many famous celebrities families. Everyone they met and played with was so professional and multi-talented, they didn’t make mistakes. Each performance was perfectly done and always professional. A favorite memory of Rhonda’s from Nashville was when she was visiting the Grand Ole Opry for their honeymoon and was called onstage to play trivia. She and DuWayne also visited the Country Music Hall of Fame where they participated in an impromptu duet for other visiting fans. Later that evening, Rhonda would have the opportunity to shake the hand of the steel guitar player who joined them in the recording studio. They also were fortunate to get to meet many performers who do the live shows with headliners such as Martina McBride,

George Strait and John Conley. The experience was so electrifying for the couple! While outdoor dining that night, as they were listening to local talent and bands, DuWayne struck up a conversation with a banjo-playing lady, only to find out later that she was a performer on the Hee Haw Show!

On March 23, 2014, which happens to be Rhonda’s birthday, opportunity once again came knocking and the couple grabbed the opportunity to record an album entitled, “I Love You Because.” This experience taught her the ways of Nashville, stating, “once you get to the recording studio and sing your music, you hire a music promoter; the music promoter presents your music all over the world.” And that is just what happened. Together they created two albums in the music industry: one a traditional country collection of songs and the second one reflecting Gospel country music. As a result of their promoter spreading their music across the globe, Rhonda earned a few honorable awards. The title song from their album, “I Love You Because” was named True Music Reports #3 hit song in 2015. In 2017, “Stars in Your Eyes” reached #1 on the International Country Music Chart, while a second song, “I Want to be a Soldier” landed as #1 on the God’s Country International Chart. Then again in 2018, her song, “Livin’ This Life” reached #1 on the International Country Music Charts. She and DuWayne feel greatly rewarded to be able to share their songs and passions with everyone. They would like to someday return to Nashville and attend a Nashville Reunion of Professional Entertainers.

All their music can be heard through their free website: duwayneandrhondaheyd.com. This summer DuWayne and Rhonda already have booked an appearance at Ashley Days in Ashley, ND in June.

Currently, DuWayne owns Heyd Construction in Grand Forks while Rhonda, 20 years later, continues to work for Noridian as a Quality Review Specialist. The Heyd’s have five grandchildren and their hobbies include music, gardening and traveling to Arizona every other year.

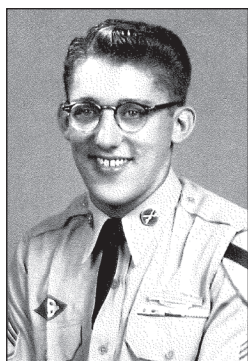

Military Honors:

Ernest Lizakowski: Oslo, Class of 1946, United States Army. I graduated with a class of 20 students: 10 boys and 10 girls. On June 30, 1948, I enlisted into the US Army. I spent most of my time as a clerk typist in Davidson Headquarters in the Occupation of Japan. As I was completing my enlistment, I returned to the US when I heard that the North Koreans were invading South Korea. Instead of returning to my Unit, I chose to go home to help with the harvest. This was a big mistake, due to the fact that since I was recalled, I was then assigned as a Rifleman in Combat Infantry Company I. For eight months, I experienced an extremely freezing winter in the trenches on the hills. In the spring, the weather was very rainy with no shelter other than poncho rain coats in sloppy mud. The summer was extremely hot and miserable with a lack of water. The water was collected from the streams where the Chinese shot at us from nearby hills. We fought from the hills with help from our artillery and sometimes from the Air Force with their machine guns, rockets and Napalm bombs, as a last resort. My time in combat as a Rifleman and later as a Squad Leader was soon ending – “WHOOPIE!”

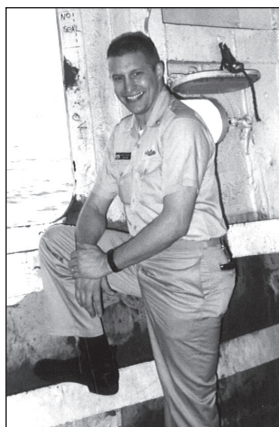
After returning home, I attended Wolverine School of Trades in Detroit, completing courses in Mechanics, Plumbing, Pipe Fitting and Welding. In 1954, I married a school teacher, Evelyn (Kiedrowski). We raised three children and 6 grandchildren. In 1957, we moved to Grand Forks, ND where I was employed in the plumbing industry. Joining the union created many traveling jobs until my retirement in 1990. Being retired for 33 years is the best job I ever had!!! Second best job is still being involved in farming.



Jacob Edgar: WAO, Class of 2007, United States Marine Corps 2008 – 2012 ~ Following the completion of my first year of college in 2008, I enlisted and served as a Corporal in the U.S. Marine Corps. I was sent to basic training at the Marine Corps depot in San Diego, California for three months, then went on to the School of Infantry (SOI) in San Diego for another two months. I

graduated with my Military Occupation Specialty (MOS) of 0311 or Infantry.

After Basic and SOI, I was selected for my first fleet assignment with the 3rd Light Armor Reconnaissance in Twenty Nine Palms, California as a Scout. Our mission included recon, vehicle interdiction and as a quick reaction force which included to move into an area quickly and set up either an offensive or defensive position for a main element to either engage or withdraw from an area. I was in the fleet for a total of 12 days before I was sent on my first deployment to Sahl Sinjar Air Base in Iraq. Once in Iraq, I worked as Security for the base, which is a common place to put newer Marines on their first Deployment. After 7 months, I returned state-side to prepare for our next Deployment. Roughly a year later, I was deployed to Afghanistan as a Team Leader to the Sangin Valley in Helmand Province. Our first major role was to protect a road being constructed that would intersect the major highway as a short-cut or supply route. The road was heavily laden with IED's as a means to disrupt the supply route. We went there with 9 light-armored vehicles and after three weeks of being guardians we returned with 4 vehicles; mine being the last one of the four. Our last major role was a 30-day op that took place near the Pakistan-Afghanistan border called Bahrum Cha, which was being used by insurgents as a way to enter and exit Afghanistan. After 7 months, I returned state-side and finished my enlistment in the summer of 2012. I returned to Warren to work as a Crop Consultant with North Star Ag and married my wife Amerae (Knoll) ~ WAO, 2009 Edgar in March of 2014. Together, we now have two beautiful children: Reece, age 3 and Ella June, age 11 months.



Lyle Palm, WHS Class of 1978, I enlisted in the United States Navy on September 1980 to become a welder attending Navy boot camp at Great Lakes Illinois from January thru February of 1981. I then attended my first U.S. Navy school in March of 1981, my class “A” school in the Philadelphia Naval Yard, my Navy rating was Hull Maintenance Technician. After completing my first training assignment in May of 1981, I was shipped out to San Diego, California to

attend the U.S. Navy's premier welding school, class “C” welding school. I then spent the next 8 months perfecting my craft, attending and passing all three advanced welding courses with the intent to become the best welder in the Navy. The Navy was making a huge investment in me, having sent me to over a year of advance welding schools, I was on the hook to perform and they got every penny back they spent on me. For the next twenty years I worked as a U.S. Navy welder, quality assurance inspector, trainer, and mentor. I was one of the lucky ones, choosing a military career path that I enjoyed and loved, with an acumen for welding and fabrication, my military career was set. During my time in the Navy, I had the pleasure of being the Leading Chief Petty Officer in charge of four different nuclear and non-nuclear welding shops, my training prepared me to weld on nuclear piping systems and associated nuclear components onboard submarines and surface ships. My motivation to serve in the United States Navy was to serve my country, as many of my family members have done over the years, gain an education and travel. I ended up getting a great career, world class education and a wonderful family along the way. I eventually retired from the Navy in April of 2001, having served on three U.S. Navy ships, USS Proteus AS 19, USS Dixon AS 37 and USS McKee AS 43 and three shore stations Naval Submarine Training Center Hawaii, Submarine base Hawaii and SIMA San Diego. Having retired, I decided to settle in San Diego, California, a very familiar place where I had raised my children and had made a home. Currently I hold the position of Chief Academic Officer for a non-profit Veterans training center, Workshops for Warriors, located in San Diego, California. If you know of an active duty service member who is transitioning out into civilian life, a veteran or wounded warrior who needs training in the following skills: CNC machining, Solidworks, Mastercam, or welding. Workshops for Warriors can help them get a new start, into a new career in just 16 weeks, all they have to do is want to learn! We are a Skill-bridge organization and we do take the GI Bill and a limited number of scholarships are available!

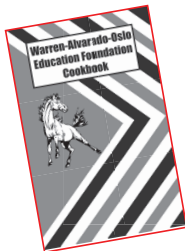

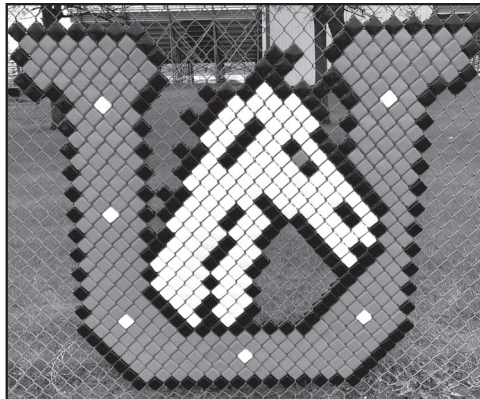
