A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

A motion was made by Mr. Barnes to adopt the agenda; second by Mrs. Krenson; motion carried unanimously.

Mrs. Krenson made a motion; second by Mr. Barnes to approve the consent agenda including minutes of the meeting held on February 13, 2020; motion carried unanimously.

The committee recommended renewal of insurance with EMC in the amount of \$241,102; motion carried unanimously.

Personnel matters were deferred to executive session.

POLICY COMMITTEE

A recommendation was made by the committee to rescind the current Policy IHF - Graduation Requirements; motion carried unanimously.

The new Policy IHF - Graduation Requirements was unanimously adopted as recommended by the committee.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

Upon recommendation of the committee, seven school buses were unanimously declared surplus and to be sold through GovDeals.com.

In an effort to address the Board's concerns regarding the placement of concrete floor slabs and footings on saturated soils at the new Sumter County High School site due to extensive rainfall,

on February 26, 2020, Matt Hightower, Project Manager for Parrish Construction Group, submitted the following steps to ensure that the materials are being installed at the highest quality:

- To obtain the proper compaction while installing underground rough-in, we have been stockpiling dirt and covering it. We then rotate the good soil with the wet soil until it becomes suitable for use. (At the cost of the subcontractor, not the owner.)
- We have been digging, placing rebar, and pouring footings daily so that ditches are not left uncovered overnight or when rain is in the forecast.
- In areas prior to concrete slab pours, we have covered with capillary fill and vapor barrier in advance of the rain.
- In the kitchen area, which is to be poured this week, we installed rock as a base in lieu of sand to reach the compaction needed beneath the slab. (At a substantial cost to Parrish Construction in an effort to continue progress)
- A Buckley representative has monitored the installation of materials to verify placement in accordance with the contract documents. TTL has also been present to inspect and verify conditions meet the contract documents. Regardless of the weather, compaction of the subgrade has been tested and verified prior to any footings or slabs being installed by an independent testing agency representing Sumter County Schools (TTL). Testing includes Dynamic Cone Penetrometer tests and manual probing.

NEW BUSINESS

A motion was made by Mrs. Roland; second by Mrs. Krenson to appoint Mr. Barnes to serve as the GSBA Summer Delegate for the Sumter County Board of Education; motion carried unanimously.

Mrs. Krenson was unanimously appointed to serve as the GSBA Summer Delegate Alternate on a motion by Mrs. Roland; second by Mr. Barnes.

A motion was made by Mrs. Roland; second by Mr. Barnes to reimburse the superintendent and board members for attending the GSBA Summer Conference in Savannah, Georgia; motion carried unanimously.

The Memorandum of Understanding between West Central Health District – WIC Program and Sumter County School System Pre-Kindergarten was approved unanimously on a motion by Mrs. Krenson; second by Mr. Barnes.

A motion was made at 7:51 p.m. by Mrs. Sylvia Roland; second by Mrs. Krenson to go into executive session for the following reasons as read by the chairman: to discuss or deliberate upon the appointment, employment, compensation, hiring, disciplinary action or dismissal, or periodic evaluation or rating of a public officer or employee or to interview applicants for the position of superintendent; (O.C.G.A.§50-14-3(b)(2) or to discuss or vote to authorize negotiations to purchase, dispose of, or lease property; authorize ordering an appraisal related to the acquisition or disposal of real estate; enter into a contract to purchase, dispose of, or lease property subject to approval in a subsequent public vote; or enter into an option to purchase, dispose of or lease real estate subject to approval in a subsequent public vote; (O.C.G.A. § 50-14-3(b)(1)). The motion carried unanimously.
