Students <u>MUST</u> be committed to attend class regularly, complete homework assignments weekly, participate in classroom activities and provide their own transportation to all programs.

All students have access to a guidance counselor for career and college planning.

Individuals wishing to enroll in the High School Diploma or GED[®] Test Preparation programs must meet the following criteria:

- *Must be 17 years of age or older
- *Must be officially withdrawn from day school
- *Must submit a copy of the official withdrawal form with parents signature (for students 17 years old)

Please bring an official transcript from all schools in which you were enrolled, as well as a copy of your withdrawal from day school.

Be prepared to take both a basic Math and English test and complete admission paperwork (approx. 45 minutes long) on the day you register.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A diploma candidate must accumulate 23 credits which include the following:

Who may attend?

English as a Second Language students age 18 and up

When does it meet?

The Book Club meets every Monday from 7:30-8:30pm. Each book session lasts for 8 weeks with the first and last meetings being in person (COVID conditions permitting) and the 6 sessions in between held on google meet. A link will be provided at the beginning of the 8-weeks that will be used each week.

What kind of books will we read?

To begin we will read some classics that are part of American culture. Students and teachers may recommend books as well. Then we vote.

In addition to reading the book we will listen to an audio version. Our last meeting of the book session will be movie night as we watch a movie based on the book. Vocabulary, culture and worksheets related to the reading will be explored in class.

EVENING PROGRAMS

ESL INTEGRATED SKILLS LEVEL 1

After successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. GRAMMAR Identify the verb "be" in the simple present tense and recognize articles, adjectives, and nouns surrounding the verb "be" and identify other verbs, negatives, questions, and short answers in the simple present tense at the introductory level.
- 2. VOCABULARY Match very simple definitions to basic vocabulary words from familiar themes (i.e. family, places, daily activities, colors, food, clothes, body parts, workplace).
- 3. LISTENING Recognize main ideas and details from introductory level listening passages.
- 4. SPEAKING/PRONUNCIATION Cite basic vocabulary words and sounds with correct intonation, construct basic yes/no questions, and state appropriate oral responses to simple questions.
- 5. READING/WRITING Identify grammar and content from introductory level reading passages and construct simple sentences in writing using introductory level grammar and vocabulary.
- 6. WORKPLACE SKILLS- Understand the soft skills required to succeed in the workplace.

ESL ENGLISH FOR THE WORKPLACE
