## Spotlight on New Milford Schools

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## **Summer Learning Resources**



On June 4th, New Milford Public Schools released their new summer reading initiative to students and families. Teachers, paras, tutors and administrators recorded a <u>promotional video</u> to the tune from Dua Lipa's hit song, *Levitating*, to encourage students to read this summer. The song itself is sung by Northville school psychologist Lynn Nissenbaum's daughter, Abby.

The video was followed by the announcement of the <u>NMPS Summer</u> <u>Learning webpage</u> for rising K-8 students. The webpage features many learning activities for literacy and mathematics, including the Governor's Reading Challenge and the Summer Math Passport for students in grades K-5. The Math Passports provide a real-world connection with local community partners and encourage families to explore New Milford. All programs are designed to motivate, encourage and build stamina through a variety of activities and choices. SMS and NMHS have their own pages for ideas and suggestions. The <u>New Milford Public Library</u> is collaborating with the district to offer additional resources and summer programs.

"We hope families make use of these resources which are offered in a fun, creative way to encourage students to continue learning during the summer months," says NMPS Superintendent Alisha DiCorpo. "At the same time, we hope families are able to take advantage of this time to relax and recharge."



### Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan

As required by the State of CT, Superintendent Alisha DiCorpo, the Central Office Cabinet, and NMPS Building Administration have developed the first version of the district's *Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan* for the fall. The full plan may be viewed on the district website <u>here</u>. The Plan incorporates portions of the 2020-21 pre-existing reopening plan that match the

most current Department of Public Health guidance from the State of Connecticut. The district will continue to reassess and review updated state guidance as it is received, and as advised by our local Department of Public Health and our District Medical Advisor. The *Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan* will be updated every six months over the course of the 2021-22 school year in order to adjust to updates that are provided to school districts from the State of CT, CDC, and Department of Public Health. Please remember that all public school districts are required to follow the mitigation strategies and guidance outlined from the State and the Department of Public Health.

A stakeholder survey accompanied the release of the first version of the Plan. As a result of survey responses, questions were asked regarding the Music program, mask wearing and snow days. Superintendent DiCorpo says, "We have heard the concerns. Answers to these questions await updated guidance from the CSDE and DPH and are not individual district considerations."



**UPDATE:** On July 9, 2021 the CDC updated their *Guidance for COVID-19 Prevention in K-12 Schools*. Then on July 27, 2021, given new evidence on the B.1.617.2 (Delta) variant, the <u>CDC updated</u> their guidance for fully vaccinated people. The CDC recommends universal indoor masking for all teachers, staff, students, and visitors to K-12 schools, regardless of vaccination status. Children should return to full-time in-person learning in the fall with layered prevention strategies in place.

Currently superintendents are awaiting further guidance from the Governor and the Commissioner of Schools. "This guidance will drive our decision making for the fall," says Superintendent DiCorpo. "Any changes to our current plan will be communicated to families shortly after receiving the guidance. We will be maintaining ventilation on buses, assigning seating and will be following all guidance regarding social distancing protocols. We will be maximizing spacing in the cafeterias and will socially distance at least three feet in all other classroom settings. The NV5 project that is ongoing with the Town will help to support proper ventilation through replacement of some or our operating mechanical systems. We will continue to share any updates with the community as they are received." The 2021-22 school year is quickly approaching and we are excited to welcome our students back! With COVID-19 still on the forefront and the ever-changing guidelines, keeping our children well and safe in school is our top priority.

Notes from the School Nurses

Our best protection from getting sick and spreading the COVID-19 virus continues to be vaccinating, masking, social distancing, and frequent handwashing. Thank you for your help in reinforcing healthy behaviors in our students.

Please continue to:

- Screen your children daily for illness prior to sending them to school
- Keep them home if they are not feeling well

**COVID-19 vaccine** - Consult your child's health care provider on the COVID-19 vaccine. The Pfizer vaccine is currently available for persons 12 years and older.

If your child has received the COVID-19 vaccine please send a copy of the card to your school nurse. This helps the school to maintain a complete immunization record for your child. In addition, it will keep them out of quarantine if they are exposed to an individual with COVID-19 as long as they remain asymptomatic.



## **Facilities Director Appointed**

At a Special Board of Education meeting on Wednesday, July 7, 2021, New Milford Public Schools Superintendent Alisha DiCorpo recommended, and the Board approved, the appointment of Matthew Cunningham, who will join New Milford Public Schools as Facilities Director.



Mr. Cunningham is coming to New Milford from the Derby Board of Education where he has served as Facilities Manager since 2019. His duties included managing facilities usage for the district, purchasing, budget preparation, and employee evaluations. He also served as the district's Facilities Committee Chair for the COVID-19 Recovery Plan and as the Safety Services Program Coordinator. During his tenure in Derby, Mr. Cunningham oversaw several large scale projects including managing logistics and support for a multi-million dollar school district ESPC project, working on plans to upgrade the COGEN plant at Derby

Middle School, and working in conjunction with City officials for the completion of a new multi-million dollar sports complex.

Prior to Derby, Mr. Cunningham was the Head Custodian at Woodland Regional High School in Beacon Falls. He has previously worked in Building Maintenance/Custodial for the Town of Monroe and as a Foreman for Home Maintenance, Inc. of Bridgeport.

Superintendent Alisha DiCorpo says, "With so many ongoing and upcoming Facilities projects, the Director is a key position. Mr. Cunningham has demonstrated that his prior management of large scale projects as well as his ability to manage multiple projects at one time will help him to organize, orchestrate and advocate for what is necessary as we begin to transition into each. Mr. Cunningham's skill set will also complement the existing team and we look forward to working with him."

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
