What is the Grading Policy?

Major Assessments (45% of your grade) I label these in Infinite Campus as MA. This includes all Unit Tests. We usually do 1 major unit test per unit. This category may also include major projects and performance assessments. A performance assessment is either a speaking or a writing assignment based on the topics that we have covered. Minor Assessments (20% of your grade) I label these in Infinite Campus as MI. This category includes Unit quizzes. There may be between 3-4 quizzes per Unit. Bell ringers will be taken up every 20 days for a minor assessment grade.

Daily Grades (15% of your grade) I label these in Infinite Campus as D. Examples of daily grades include activity participation such as games or activities in class like task cards. I usually count activities like listening tasks and workbook/worksheets as daily grades.

Final Exam (20% of your grade) Please be aware of the new exemption policy for final exams. Students must have a B average (80 or above), during COVID-19, there are no attendance requirements for exemptions, you must not have been assigned ISS/OS during the semester, and must have all financial obligations cleared to the school.
