Some Houston County Career Academy faculty joined other members of the Board of Education at the Lieutenant Governor's 4th Annual Business and Education Summit in Conyers, GA on November 13-14th. This summit is Georgia Lieutenant Governor Casey Cagle's opportunity to address trends in education within career academies of Georgia as well as highlight emerging industries in Georgia that our schools can help prepare for a workforce. Over the two day summit, participants toured two Georgia career academies, Rockdale Career Academy and Newton College and Career Academy. Participants were able to see first-hand how these schools operate and were given very vital insight into the day of a career academy student.

In addition to the tours of the facilities, Casey Cagle spoke support of career academies and building business partnerships within the community as well as partnerships with technical colleges. He praised career academies for the work that they have been doing and awarded the 2014 Career Academy of the Year and Business Partner of the Year. Several panel discussions took place over the two days. The first panel provided a Q & A over Georgia Biosciences and up and coming needs for workers in those fields. The second was "Georgia Health IT: Innovations Shaping Today's Industry" and showcased CEO's and CMO's from companies in Georgia that provided information on how to better prepare students to be marketable and employable upon graduation from high school. There were many opportunities over the two days to hear about other trends in Georgia, namely building partnerships and the booming film and production industry in Georgia, which has been coined "Hollywood of the South". HCBOE employees were treated to a tour of Triple Horse Studios in Covington and got a special taste of the possibilities within Georgia's film industry.

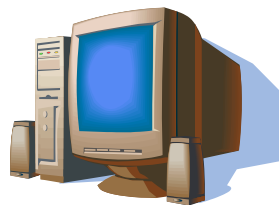

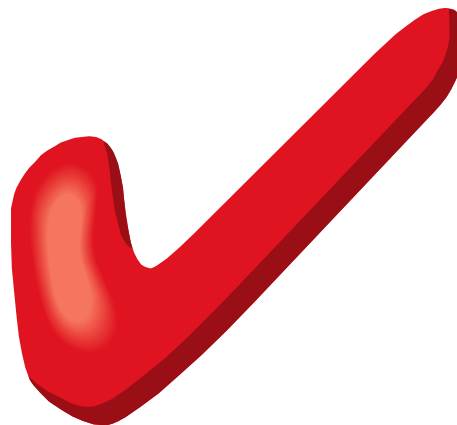

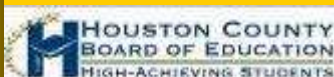
