

Maundy Thursday April 1, 2021 - 6:30PM

AS WE GATHER: As part of Holy Week, we observe an ancient custom of the early Christian Church. Even though people go home to rest and carry out their normal duties, they are encouraged to remember that they are still "worshiping" and remembering the events of Holy Week. No benediction (blessing) concludes this service as an indication that the service continues for two more days. The name Maundy Thursday comes from the Latin word mandatum, which means commandment. It is taken from Jesus' words to the disciples in John 13:34: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another." Today, we remember the first Passover meal and celebrate the meal that was given to us when Jesus celebrated Passover---on the night when He was betrayed.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

Pastor:

We are gathered on this most holy night when our Lord Jesus sealed His oneness with His followers through a simple meal of bread and wine. On this night we receive the most precious gift of the forgiveness of sins. God our Father desires a relationship with all His children. For this purpose, He has established the new testament through His Son, Christ Jesus, who gave His body and shed His blood for our life and salvation.

The Father declares, "I will be their God, and they shall be My people." Thus gathered in the name and presence of the Blessed Trinity, we the

people of God, make our confession before God

and before one another.

People: We are each born in sin and are by nature

unclean.

Pastor: We name before You our faults and our sins.

People: We have not been persuaded by Your love for

us; selfishness and unkindness have pervaded our words, thoughts, and deeds. We have not loved and served our neighbors, but instead have served ourselves and sought to protect our

own interests.

Pastor: We openly acknowledge our sins and desire to turn

away from them.

People: Standing guilty before God the Holy Trinity, we

admit we deserve condemnation and death.

Pastor: We flee to Christ Jesus, who alone washes away

our sins and restores our relationship with the

Father.

People: Having been called, gathered, and enlightened

by the Holy Spirit, we cry out to Jesus for mercy and grace, holding on to nothing but His cross.

Pastor: Jesus died giving His body and shedding His blood

for you. Only through Jesus can anyone receive forgiveness and everlasting life. In the stead and by the command of Him whose blood-stained Calvary's cross and is now given to us in the Holy Sacrament, I as a called and ordained servant of Christ announce the grace of God to all of you and by the command of Jesus I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of

the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

SALUTATION

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Exodus 12:1-14

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, ² "This month shall be for you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year for you. ³ Tell all the congregation of Israel that on the tenth day of this month every man shall take a lamb according to their fathers' houses, a lamb for a household. ⁴ And if the household is too small for a lamb, then he and his nearest neighbor shall take according to the number of persons; according to what each can eat you shall make your count for the lamb. ⁵ Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male a year old. You may take it from the sheep or from the goats, ⁶ and you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month, when the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill their lambs at twilight.

⁷ "Then they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. 8 They shall eat the flesh that night, roasted on the fire; with unleavened bread and bitter herbs they shall eat it. ⁹Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted, its head with its legs and its inner parts. ¹⁰ And you shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. ¹¹In this manner you shall eat it: with your belt fastened, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. And you shall eat it in haste. It is the LORD's Passover. ¹² For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the LORD. ¹³ The blood shall be a sign for you, on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague will befall you to destroy you, when I strike the land of Egypt.

¹⁴ "This day shall be for you a memorial day, and you shall keep it as a feast to the LORD; throughout your generations, as a statute forever, you shall keep it as a feast.

Pastor: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

¹² And on the first day of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, his disciples said to him, "Where will you have us go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?"

¹³ And he sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city, and a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him, ¹⁴ and wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, Where is my guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' ¹⁵ And he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready; there prepare for us." ¹⁶ And the disciples set out and went to the city and found it just as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover.

¹⁷ And when it was evening, he came with the twelve. ¹⁸ And as they were reclining at table and eating, Jesus said, "Truly, I say to you, one of you will betray me, one who is eating with me." ¹⁹ They began to be sorrowful and to say to him one after another, "Is it I?" ²⁰ He said to them, "It is one of the twelve, one who is dipping bread into the dish with me. ²¹ For the Son of Man goes as it is written of him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born."

²² And as they were eating, he took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to them, and said, "Take; this is my body." ²³ And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, and they all drank of it. ²⁴ And he said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. ²⁵ Truly, I say to you, I will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

Pastor: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.
